Railroad Shares Fare Better on Higher List

New York — Stocks crept higher today on dull volume. Railroad issues fared better than other major groups, largely on a rise of more than a point in New York Central.

Industrials managed to move ahead on gains of better than two points in Eastman Kodak and better than a point in American Telephone, and Du Pont. Utilities firmed on average thanks to better prices in Houston Lighting and a few others.

Oils were about steady. Foster Wheeler in the oil equipments was a strong spot.

Motors ruled steady to firm. Steels made little progress. Special issues stood out with Haves up more than four points and Brunswick Balke up more than three points.

Curtiss-Wright leaped up two points late in the day.

Stricter Potato Controls Urged

Ontario — Stricter controls on marketing of potatoes from the Idaho-eastern Oregon area were recommended here today by the Idaho-Eastern Oregon Potato Committee.

The committee recommended that Round Red varieties be of 1 1/2 inches minimum diameter with a maturity tolerance of 10 per cent for spuds having more than 50 per cent missing or feathered skin.

For the White Rose variety a minimum size of five ounces was recommended for U.S. No. 2's. For U.S. No. 1's and better a minimum size of two inches with a maturity tolerance of 21 per cent was suggested.

The grade and size of Russets and Early Gems was set at U.S. No. 2 or better with a minimum size of two inches. Maturity tolerance of 10 per cent for potatoes with 50 per cent or more of the skin missing or feathered also was suggested.

Sutherland Plant To Close Down Friday

Roseburg — Martin Bros. Container and Timber Products Corp. today announced indefinite closure of its Sutherland, Ore., operations, effective tomorrow.

About 90 men were due to be laid off, 70 of them immediately. But a company spokesman said every effort would be made to absorb as many as possible at the larger Oakland, Ore., operations of the firm.

Officials said the closure would be for an indefinite period, "due to general market conditions."
