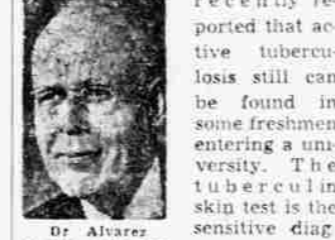

Tuberculosis in University Students



Dr. J. Arthur Myers, Ruth E. Boynton, and Harold S. Diehl, of the University of Minnesota, recently reported that active tuberculosis still can be found in some freshmen entering a university. The tuberculin skin test is the sensitive diagnostic criterion.

Persons with this symptom usually have a tendency to fibrosis or bursitis or arthritis of some kind. Often this soreness and stiffness and pain, coming in the morning enables the physician to say that the trouble is arthritic in origin.
