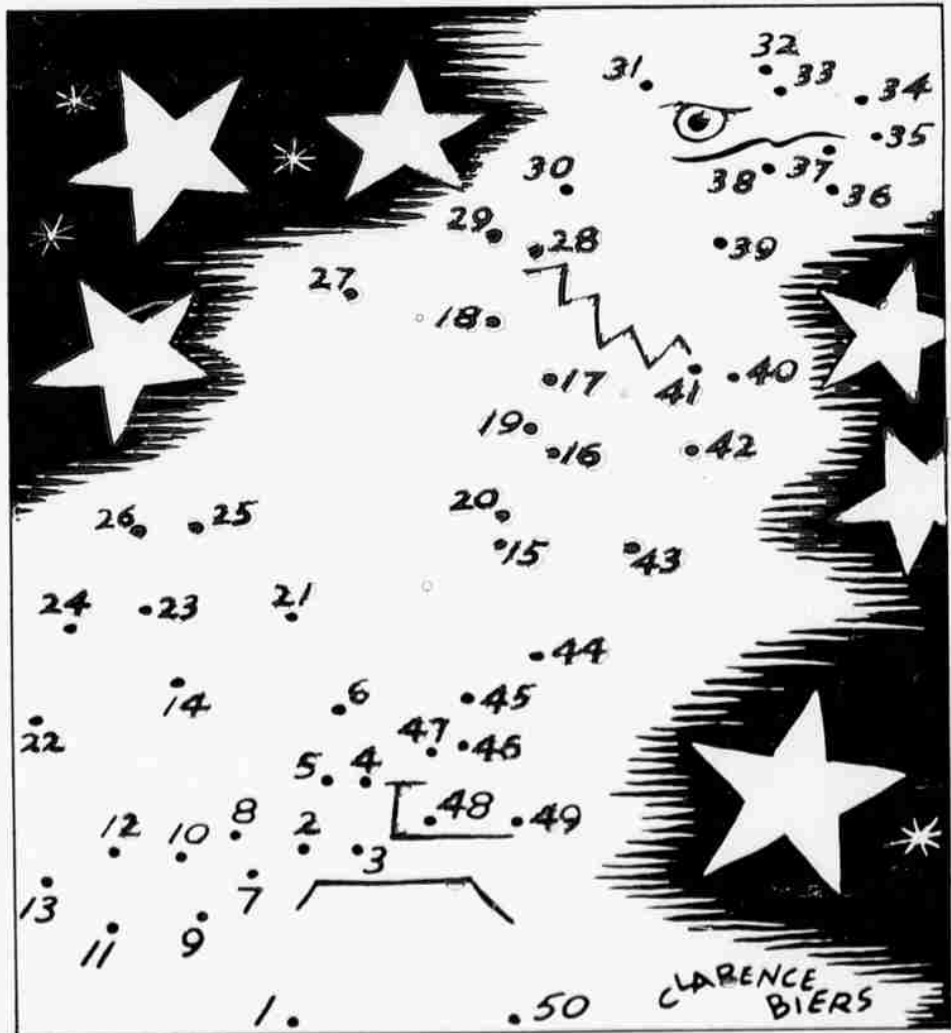


## JUNIOR TREASURE CHEST

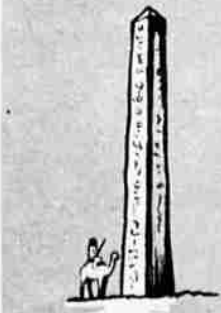
1. Each player must put on a hat.

Try this amusing game at your next party. Give each guest a stick of gum, a small card, and two or three tooth-picks. Let them chew the gum for a while (during some other games), then tell them to put the gum on the center of their cards.
