Midway, Island of Birds, To Be Southwest Anchor

Midway Island — This tiny Pacific island is a bird sanctuary with a \$40 million military future.

Often described in the past as a forelorn airstrip surrounded by gooney birds, military strategists have designated Midway as the southwest anchor of the Distant Early Warning line.

Phoenix Pilot Named Winner of Powder Puff Derby

Philadelphia — Mrs. Alice Roberts, Phoenix, and her co-pilot Mrs. Iris Critchell Palos Verdes Estates, Calif., today were named winners of the 11th transcontinental Powder Puff Derby.

The women pilots averaged a top ground speed of 188 miles per hour over the 2,567-mile route from San Mateo, Calif., to North Philadelphia airport. Mrs. Roberts, who has over 550 hours flying time, placed second in the annual all-women race the past two years. Mrs. Roberts, mother of two children, is the wife of a pilot. She and Mrs. Critchell will receive a trophy and \$800 first place prize.

\$600 for Second. The second team was Mrs. Doris Eacret, Elko, Nev., and Mrs. Jean Parker Rose, Arcadia, Calif. Their average ground speed was 138 miles per hour. Second place winners will receive \$600 and a trophy.

Mrs. Barbara Kiernan, Andover, Mass., a helicopter test pilot, and her copilot, Mrs. Esther Gardiner, Waterfield, Conn., placed third. Mrs. Kiernan averaged 189 miles per hour but her handicap was 169, giving her a total score of 20.4. Mrs. Roberts, with a handicap of 162, had a total score of 26.5.

The winners were selected on total points determined through flying time, general performance and handicaps.

Wreckage Sifted For Crash Clues

Anchorage, Alaska — Federal investigators sifted through the charred wreckage of a twin-engine aircraft at King Salmon, Alaska, today, seeking the cause of a crash which killed six persons.

Witnesses at King Salmon, about 300 miles southwest of here, said the Lockheed Lodestar made a normal takeoff Wednesday morning, but suddenly shot into a vertical climb. They said one or both engines apparently quit and the craft plunged nose down into the runway.

Civil Aeronautics Administration investigators identified the victims as Charles Vose of the Virgin Islands, the owner of the plane; Edward Cologny, Bay Port, N. Y.; the pilot, Ralph Huthies, Brooklyn, N. Y.; the copilot, Polly Evans, Brooklyn; and Mrs. Harold B. Friele and her daughter-in-law, Mrs. Hawkin B. Friele, both of Seattle.

Shah of Iran Plans Return Home Friday

Nice, France — The Shah of Iran and Empress Soroya will fly back to their earthquake-ravaged country Friday, it was announced today. They had planned to cut short their European tour today, but no appropriate chartered airliner was available to carry the large imperial retinue back to Tehran.

Jacksonville, Fla. — The federal government is slightly in arrears on its taxes, the city reported today.

Portland Youth Drowns When Boat Tips Over

Camas, Wash. — Robert Elmer Smith, 22, Portland, drowned Wednesday afternoon when a small boat tipped over in Lackamas lake near here.

Other members of the boating party said the craft struck Smith in the face as it overturned. Camas firemen recovered the body.

Muskegon, Mich. — Soda pop has been ruled out during working hours for thirsty North Muskegon city officials and employees. Aldermen denied a request for installation of a soft drink vending machine, stating that the "logical but unlikely climax would see the city dispensing beer for its constituents."

Husband, Bride, 11 Have Family Problem

Murfreesboro, Tenn. — Jesse H. Scott, 44, said today that he and his 11-year-old bride might have to move to another county if his wife's folks won't let her stay at home.

Scott, who said he yielded to a barrage of love letters and married young Portia Virginia Johnson in Mississippi last May 27, indicated he was perfectly willing to let his wife remain with her parents until she became of legal age.

"However," he said, "if Portia can't keep on living at home we may have to move to Shelby county to live. I think her parents and I can work it out, we're all friends."

Locust Plague Threatens Africa and Middle East

Rome — The worst locust plague in 28 years is threatening North Africa, the Nile Valley and the Middle East, the United Nations Food and Agricultural Organization FAO said today.

FAO experts compared the situation with the 1929-30 plague "considered the most serious invasion year in modern history." They said major danger spots are Libya, Tunisia, Chad, Sudan and Saudi Arabia.
