Mysterious Object Alarming New England Said Weather Balloon

Boston — A high flying object which soared over New England Wednesday, alarming hundreds of residents and causing the Air Force to send up a jet fighter plane, was identified as a weather balloon today.

Officials at the Air Force Cambridge Research Center at Hanscom Field in Lawrence said it was nothing more than "Moby Dick," a high altitude balloon used to record weather data in the upper stratosphere.

A spokesman said the balloon was launched in Vernalis, Calif., by the Air Force and could be deflated from the ground by "merely pushing a button."

Information recorded by the balloon's instruments are automatically sent to California by radio, according to the official. Jet Dispatched

However, Otis Air Force Base authorities on Cape Cod appar-

ently didn't recognize the device since a high altitude jet fighter was sent to view the object after the base was flooded by telephone calls.

Police and newspaper switchboards from New Haven, Conn., to Brunswick, Maine, were also deluged by phone calls with residents reporting such unlikely things as "flying saucers," "a Russian device" and "an earth satellite which got away."

Many callers claimed the balloon changed colors in flight, ranging from a bright red to silver-blue. Scientists explained that this phenomenon was caused by the reflection of the setting sun's rays on the plastic balloon covering.

High Flyer
Scientists said the device was drifting at a height of about 100,000 feet. Weather instruments are contained in a package which hangs beneath the balloon and directions for forwarding the contents are written on the box in English, French and Spanish.

Persons finding a downed balloon can collect a \$25 reward by returning the contents of the box to the Air Force, officials said.

One "Moby Dick" came to earth in Spain, according to a spokesman. He said most of the balloons were never glimpsed by the nation's residents since their high altitude usually kept them far above clouds and haze in the sky. Over New England Wednesday night the skies were unusually clear.

The research center said the balloons were launched quite frequently.

'Oriental Flu' Vaccine Ordered
Washington—The government told drug manufacturers today to proceed with mass production of a vaccine effective in warding off the highly contagious "Oriental flu," now spreading throughout the world.

Working closely together, government and industry scientists developed the vaccine in a "crash program" to make it available by the start of the flu season this fall.

The Public Health Service announced Wednesday the vaccine has been tested successfully on human volunteers injected with the Oriental virus.

The service has sent specifications for the vaccine to six manufacturers and expects them to begin turning out batches of shots soon.

A spokesman for the service said the vaccine, like others used in combatting influenza, is not 100 per cent effective. But it was successful enough to start production immediately.

Duncan Says People Have Duty To Take Interest in House

"All of you have a responsibility to take an interest in what goes on up there at the legislature," State Rep. Robert Duncan, Medford, declared yesterday in a luncheon talk to the Medford Kiwanis club.

"You have a responsibility to express yourself," he said, stating also that taking interest in sessions of the legislature is a "duty."

Duncan spoke of the bill proposing the abolition of the death penalty for crime as probably the legislature's most important measure going on the ballot. He stated that those who are executed generally are "the poor and the friendless."

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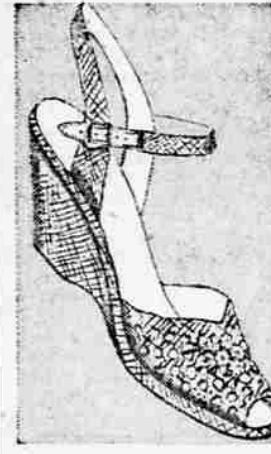

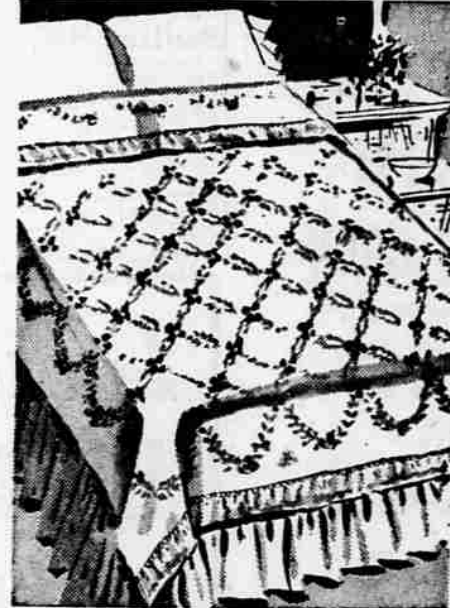

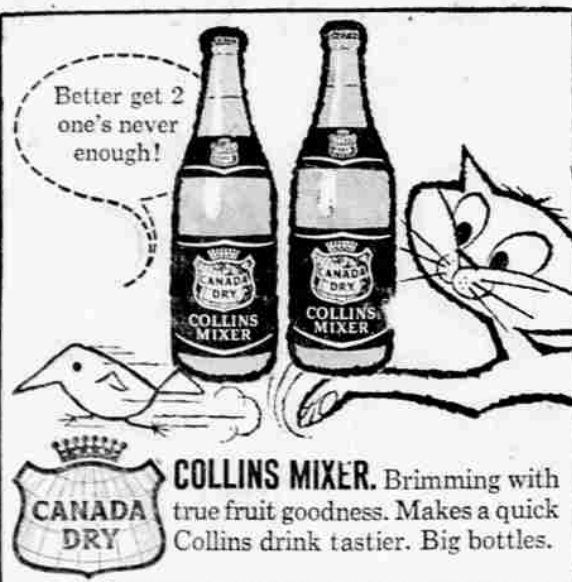
