Here at the American institute we are often asked to counsel people who think they are in love—but who are not sure. They want to marry, they have paired off with partners, but they want to be certain that their feeling is genuine. Here are some questions which a marriage counselor might ask you in determining the reality of your love:

1. Do you feel that your friend is equal of your father and superior to the other friends you might marry?
2. Do you feel depressed or restless when you are away from him?
3. Do you have more than three common hobbies or interests which you could pursue together after marriage?
4. Do you find it easy to "give in" to your friend's preferences if they are different from yours?
5. Do you want to marry this person?
6. Does this person have qualities valuable in the heredity of your children?
7. Does he have many friends with whom you feel at ease?
8. Do you admire this person's mind as well as his body? Are You Really In Love?
9. Do you always find enough things to talk about no matter how frequently you see each other?
10. Do you agree on at least 75 per cent of his viewpoints?
11. Do you feel proud of this person's appearance, manners, and personality?
12. Can you imagine yourselves, together, at your golden anniversary—and feel a sense of warmth?
13. Do you respect each other's judgement?
14. Do you feel that you are really truthful and frank with each other?
15. Does your family approve of your friend?
16. Do your friends approve of him?
17. Do children like him?
18. Do you feel confident of his kindness and consideration?
19. Do you feel your love for him increasing?
20. Are you of similar age, background, and tastes?

If you can truthfully answer yes to sixteen or more of these questions, chances are that you are really in love. If not, wait until you can be more certain of your own feelings.
