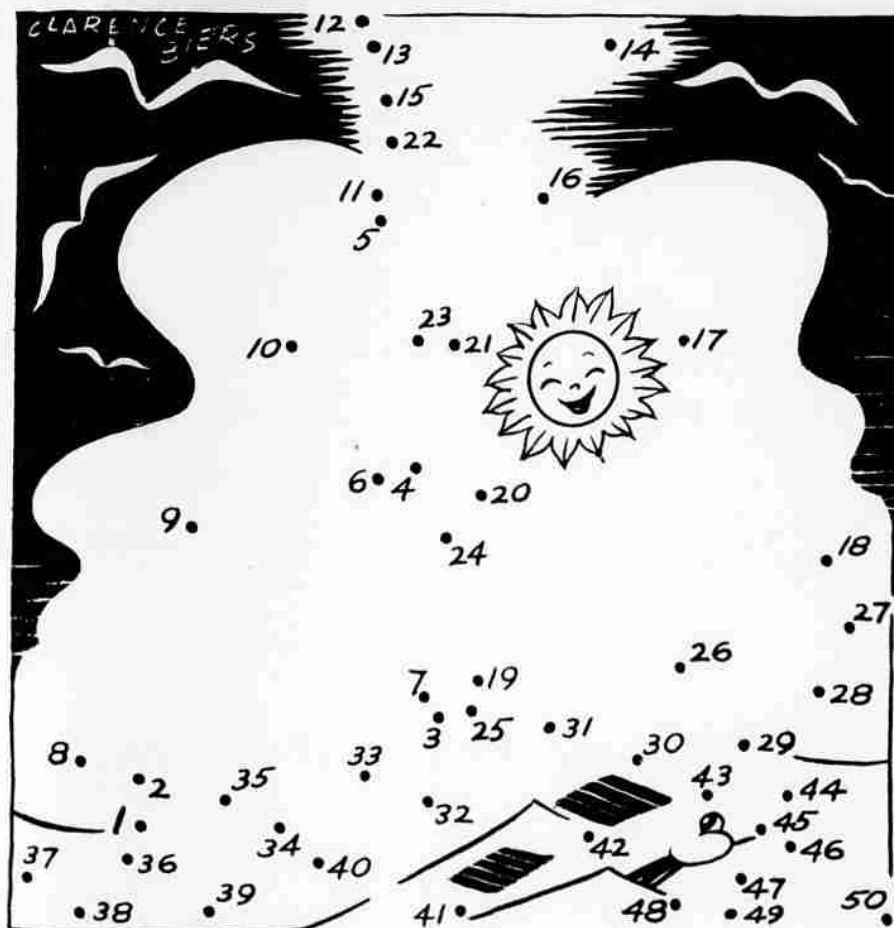

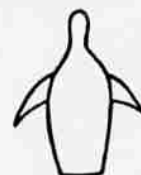

Let's Draw a Penguin

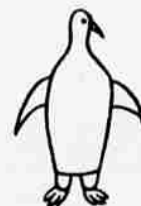
