The Deaf Infant

According to Dr. John F. Daley, of the Hearing and Speech Center of the New York University Bellevue Medical Center, in New York, deafness should be discovered as early as possible in infants, and quickly treated.

The child should immediately be fitted with a hearing-aid and ear phones so that he can utilize the benefit of what little hearing he has. Half of the children with marked deafness are suffering from some other defect. Fortunately, total deafness is rare. Three instances of it have been seen in 700 cases. Some 99 per cent of the children suffer from a congenital abnormality of the nerves that run to the ears.

One of the simplest tests of hearing that can be applied shortly after birth is the so-called "startle" or "blink response" of the infant to a sudden noise. Dr. Don M. Markle has tested his infant's hearing by crumpling a paper near him.

At the recent meeting of the American Medical Association in New York I had a pleasant and stimulating visit with Mrs. Spencer Tracy, who was showing doctors something about the wonderful work that is being done in Los Angeles by the John Tracy Clinic for deaf children.

Without charge the school sends out instructions to mothers all over the world, telling them how to teach their deaf children. The address of the clinic is 806 W. Adams, Los Angeles 7, Calif.

The Danger To Infants From Base Plugs

At a recent meeting of the plastic surgeons, Dr. V. D. Hyslop told of the terrible burns of the mouth which result when a creeping child finds a bit of wire and, with one peep in his mouth, sticks the other into an electric outlet in the baseboard.

Horrible disfigurement can follow if a good plastic surgeon is not quickly called to repair the defect in the cheek.

World Bank Suggests Program for Jordan

Washington — The world bank made public Saturday a report recommending a 10-year \$118,000,000 economic development program for the Arab kingdom of Jordan.

The report was written by a bank mission which surveyed the Jordanian economy at the request of the Amman government in the spring of 1955.

The mission's findings were sent in draft form to Amman in April, 1956, and were transmitted formally last January, the bank said. They were not made public until now because of the recent political crisis in which anti-western elements plotted to get rid of King Hussein.
