The Medical Roundup

A Useful Medical Dictionary

To those hundreds of people who ask me for a book that, in case of need, will tell them quickly what a medical word means, I will say that the best thing I've seen for a long time is "The Encyclopedic Guide to Nursing," by Helen Hansen, a nurse (McGraw-Hill Book Co., N.Y.). She defines beautifully over 20,000 words. Many intelligent people will want to have this book on their library shelves. Then, if the doctor tells them they have oxaluria or hepatitis or Henoch's purpura, they can quickly get a good idea of what has gone wrong.

New Teeth For Old

I was just reading a second edition of a delightful little book by Dr. Victor H. Sears, formerly a professor of dentistry. It is called "New Teeth for Old" (Mosby, St. Louis). Those persons who are now facing the loss of their teeth, and the day when they have to wear dentures, will find in this book the answer to all their questions. As Dr. Sears says, there is a great deal of psychology in getting dentures and becoming used to wearing them. So many neurotic and hypersensitive people drive their dentists nearly crazy, because they are so fussy or easily

distressed. I can often guess that a certain type of fussy woman about 50 has in her handbag three or four sets of dentures, none of which she wears. Because she thought she was allergic to the plastic base, she finally had one very expensive set made of some metal, but that one bothers her as much as the cheaper ones did.

Oftentimes the woman who can't wear dentures tells me that she always gagged so easily that she seldom could brush her teeth. She may also be unable even to try to use bifocal glasses. Whenever I see a woman like this in my office, I advise strongly against the extraction of all her remaining teeth—I am so sure she'll regret it.

Highway 99 Paving In Ashland Starts

Ashland — J. C. Compton company, contractors, are paving the 1.1 mile four-lane strip of Highway 99 just north of Ashland.

Paving began Monday and will be finished in about 19 days, the state highway department office here has reported. Asphaltic concrete is being placed on the highway, known as the Ashland undercrossing, Helman st. section.

Compton company is under contract to the state highway department. The work is combined with a federal aid project.

Bids Opened for Two Ranger Stations

An apparent low bid of \$42,455 was submitted by A. F. Fitzgerald, Klamath Falls, for construction of two ranger stations at Butte Falls and Fort Klamath in the Rogue River National forest.

Bids were opened in the Portland office yesterday.

Medford contractors bidding on the Butte Falls project only were Don L. Jacobs company, \$23,060, and T. R. Florey, \$26,883.

The buildings will be on story of frame construction, measuring 40 by 60 and 30 by 64 feet. Septic tanks, drainage fields and water lines will be required.

Off-Duty City Policemen To Climb McLoughlin

Off-duty Medford city policemen and their families plan to hike up Mt. McLoughlin Sunday, Aug. 4, according to Patrolman Robert J. Allen, who is in charge.

About 15 persons are expected to make the climb.

Scotland Will Build Atomic Power Station

London — Scotland has received permission to build its first atomic power station.

Secretary of State for Scotland told the House of Commons Tuesday that a \$103,600,000 nuclear generating plant will be built in southwestern Scotland. It will produce one-fourth of the total output of electricity for the south of Scotland.
