2 Young The Dalles Girls Clubbed While Sleeping in Yard

The Dalles—An unknown assailant attacked two 11-year-old girls early today as they were sleeping outdoors, and fractured the skull of one of them.

The girls were sleeping in sleeping bags in the yard of Mr. and Mrs. Fred Heldt here. The intruder first struck Mary Mathew, daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Ray Mathew, fracturing her skull and knocking her unconscious.

Then he struck Barbara Heldt but the blow did not knock her out. She started screaming and her father rushed to the yard. The assailant, apparently startled by the screaming, had fled.

Police were called and both girls were rushed to The Dalles General hospital, where it was determined Mary was suffering from a fractured skull and Barbara, from less serious injuries. Police said they had no lead yet as to the identity of the attacker.
