# Strike Threatens Milk Deliveries

New York — Last-ditch efforts began today to avert "the real threat" of a milk strike at midnight that would cut off nearly all raw milk deliveries to the metropolitan area.

A federal mediator said the situation looked "grav" before officials of the International Brotherhood of Teamsters called a meeting for today with officers of the Dairy Transport Association, an employer group.

The Teamsters, whose members drive the trucks that deliver about 95 per cent of the milk to the New York City area, has called a strike for 12:01 a.m. Saturday, unless wage and other demands are met.

The more than 1,100 drivers are asking a wage-welfare package of 75 cents an hour, plus other benefits.

An organization of milk dealers called on the governors of New York and New Jersey and Teamsters President Dave Beck to help avert the strike.

Health officials said they had assurances from the union, distributors and farmers that there would be no interruption of milk supplies for hospitals and institutions, caring for children, the sick and the aged.

The walkout loomed as two other milk strikes in upstate New York fizzled out after two days of picketing by farmers seeking higher milk prices.

# Book in Library Here Tallulah Bankhead's

The book, "Back-seat Driver," by Mabel Louise Robinson, bears the inscription, "For Tallulah Bankhead, a salute from one victim to another," over the author's autograph.

"Back-seat Driver" is the story of Riley, a wire-haired terrier who traveled extensively with his master, a physician, and always directed the doctor in his driving. What Riley didn't know about driving was hardly worth knowing in his own estimation. Then one day Riley got a car of his own, and the things that happened to him in it were most surprising.

Although the Medford Public Library does not usually find it an economy to purchase used books, it did recently take advantage of an opportunity to select from an extensive catalog of one-read, nearly new, reviewers' copies of needed books for junior readers, Miss Webster said.
