Stock Market Trading Falls Off; No Demand

New York — Trading fell off sharply on the stock market today, with prices slipping on lack of demand.

Leading issues dipped fractions to a point or so. Some of the specials had losses of 2 points or more. A few rose a point or more.

Industrials were off a little more than the one-half of 1 per cent and rails showed a smaller decline. Utilities, thanks to strength in one or two issues, managed to show a small net gain.

Dow Jones final stock averages: 30 industrials 481.46, off 3.68; 20 railroads 140.45, off 0.80; 15 utilities 68.09, up 0.01, and 65 stocks 166.89.

Sales today were about 1,500,000 shares compared with 1,720,000 shares Wednesday.
