SOC Teacher Heads Stanford Meeting

Ashland — Miss Irene Hollenbeck, associate professor of science at Southern Oregon College, will preside over the western meeting of the National Association of Biology Teachers on the Stanford campus August 23-28, as president-elect.

Dr. John Brenkelman, president, is unable to attend.

Explaining that the week-long convocation was to be held in conjunction with the annual meeting of the Western Institute of Biological Sciences, Miss Hollenbeck announced that she would participate in a pre-convention field trip of the Botanical Society of America. After the convention she will join with the members of the botanical section of the Ecological Society of America for a two-day tour.
