Funds Available for Columbia River Project

Washington — Sen. Henry Jackson (D-Wash.) reported here Thursday that the Portland district Army engineers have proposed an allocation of \$227,000 "for early construction" of a navigation project on the Columbia river.

Sen. Jackson said the proposed project would extend from Chinook, Wash., to the head of Sand Island and would consist of improvement to a small boat basin by construction of a breakwater and by dredging the entrance channel and come from a lump sum appropriation by Congress for small authorized projects.

ARTIFICIAL INSEMINATION

Recently, in New York, I was the guest of the American Society for the Study of Sterility, a group of devoted physicians who, each year, help hundreds of couples to have children they so greatly want. Naturally, the doctors cannot always over-

come the sterility of the husband or the wife, but in a considerable percentage of cases, their treatment enables the wife to conceive.

My little contribution to the meeting was to encourage the doctors to go on with their efforts to give many women the child they want with the help of artificial insemination from a donor, whose identity is unknown to the couple. I feel strongly that since ample experience has now shown that this method can be satisfactory to both husband and wife, no one should rise up to say they cannot have a child in this way.

The meddler may not like the idea, or he may not approve of the practice, or he may doubt if his church would approve of it, but still, I think he would do well to mind his own business.

Registration Set For Elk-Trailers

Elk-Trail school registration will be held Sept. 3, Robert G. Work, elementary school principal, announced Thursday.

No lunches will be needed, he added, since school will be dismissed at noon the first day.

School busses will run regular morning schedules Sept. 3. The cafeteria will operate Sept. 4 and children will have a full day of school that day.

"All children entering the first grade for the first time this year must have their birth and health certificates showing they will be six years old on or before Nov. 15, 1957," Work said.

Lola Work, second grade; Ruth Sawyer, third grade and girls' physical education; Mrs. Albert Johnson, fourth grade (half day); Gary Monikl, music teacher (half day).

Teachers returning are: Mrs. Rowena Wild, first grade; Barry Campbell, fourth, seventh and eighth grades and boys' physical education; Ernest Sackett, fifth and sixth grades teacher and Robert G. Work, seventh and eighth grades and principal.

Senate Passes Bill For Immigration

Washington — The Senate Wednesday night passed the Kennedy Immigration bill, of which Sen. Richard L. Neuberger (D-Ore.) is co-sponsor.

Sen. Neuberger said this finally helps to solve the orphan adoption question "which is important to so many Oregon families."

The bill provides for admission of unlimited number of alien orphans who are adopted by American citizens during the next two years.

Chairman James Eastland (D-Miss.) of the judiciary committee told Sen. Neuberger on the Senate floor that he anticipated no difficulty in extending the orphan provision following the two-year trial period. Sen. Eastland also told the Senate that Sen. Neuberger "is one of those most responsible" for the orphan section being in the bill. Orphans already in the country from Korea and elsewhere will be admitted to citizenship under this legislation.

NOT TOO BAD

Brentwood, England — An English Army officer, testifying Wednesday on behalf of two of his men charged with car theft, said the men were lawless, slovenly, irresponsible and lazy but had "good" army character. Prosecutor John Marriage said, "I dread to think what one has to do to get a bad character in the army."
