Between 1916 and 1954, the U.S. Weather Bureau recorded 666 tornadoes in Texas.

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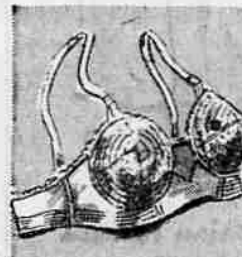
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
