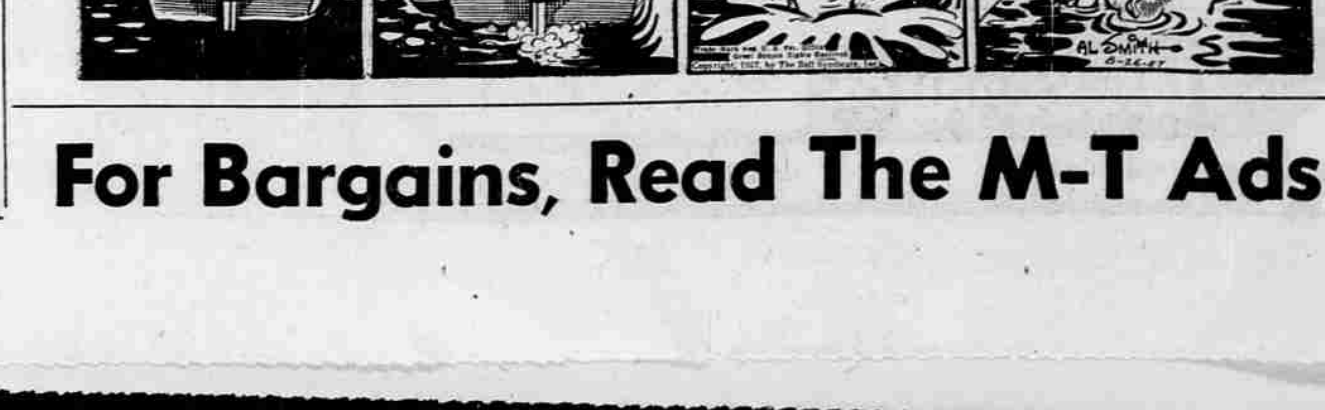
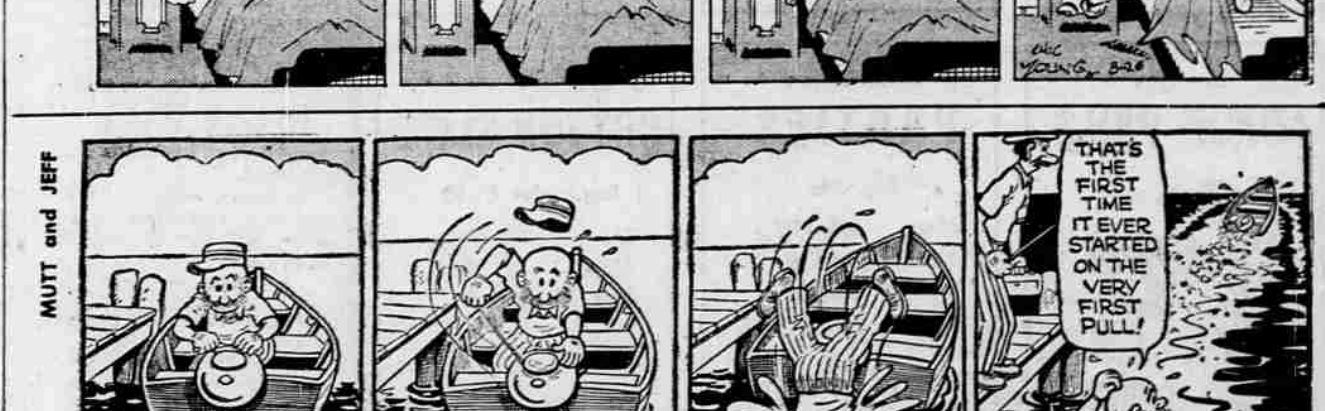
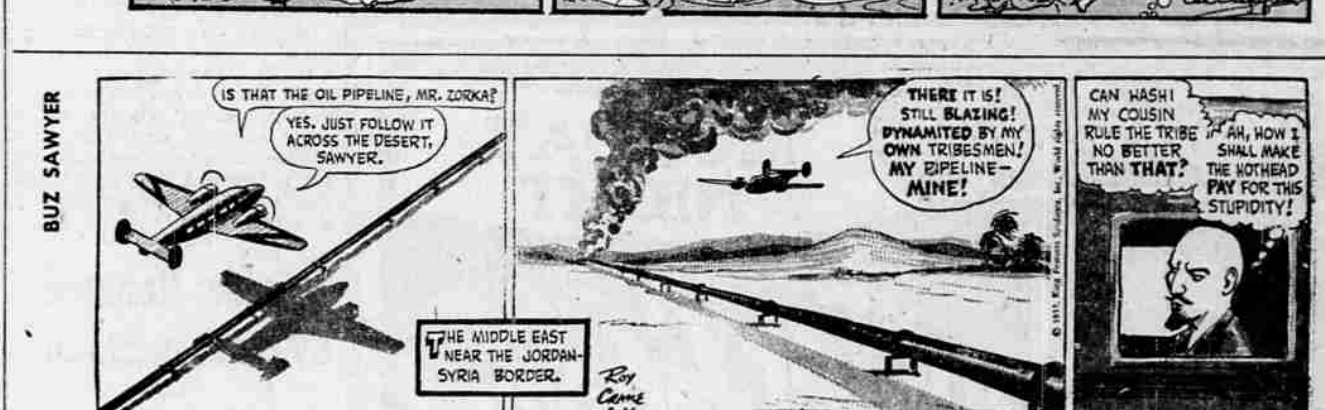
CROSSWORD PUZZLE
