Advisory Board Takes Tour of Forest Area

Salem — The Oregon and California Lands Advisory board toured some of their forest areas in the Little North Fork basin yesterday to check on developments in forest management.

Some 30 persons, led by officials of the U.S. bureau of land management, made the tour. A side trip was also taken to view work of the fish and wildlife service in building a tunnel at Elkhorn Falls to permit salmon to reach spawning grounds above the falls.

More rapid restocking of O&C lands is now possible through use of a larger staff and enforcement of stricter rules for reseedling, replanting and snag-felling, the advisory board was told.

Accompanying the group was State Forester Dwight Phipps and Edward Woolley, director of the bureau of land management which controls O&C lands.

Two Important Cases Await Supreme Court

Salem — Two important cases await the decision of the Oregon Supreme Court which opens its fall term here Sept. 11. First case to be heard will be an appeal of State Rep. Tom Monaghan, Milwaukee Democrat, who would like to hold his legislative job while teaching school.

Both the attorney general and Circuit Judge Ralph Holman of Oregon City have ruled that Monaghan can not hold both jobs.

Also set for a Sept. 11 hearing is the habeas corpus appeal of James Quenton Anderson, now under life sentence for a murder on the Klamath Indian reservation. Anderson claims a Federal statute giving the state jurisdiction on the reservation is unconstitutional.

The high court has already denied one appeal by Anderson.
