# AGENCIES ASSIST LUMBER INDUSTRY

Direct assistance to small business in a hard-pressed lumber industry is being initiated at the local level by joint action between the U. S. corps of engineers and the Small Business Administration, according to the Jackson County Chamber of Commerce.

John G. Barnett, branch manager, announced that the Portland office of SBA and the Lumber Purchasing branch of the corps of engineers have started a program of exclusive awards on lumber purchases for firms qualifying as small business in the SBA program.

This purchase action is termed "set-aside" and the initial bids were opened Aug. 23 and Aug. 30, consisting of lumber and plywood. By terms of the procurement, firms with more than 500 employees, and foreign firms are not permitted to compete, the chamber said.

An active competition at reasonable prices to the government will determine the future extent of this program. This action establishes two of the largest federal procurement agencies in the area, the corps of engineers and Bonneville Power administration as actively supporting the
