Salem — Sale of fertilizers in Oregon for the first six months of 1957 was at an all-time high, the State Agriculture Department reported today. The record is contrary to national trends.

The 1957 tonnage reported of fertilizers during the period was 138,926 tons, compared with 120,871 in 1956.

Portland Coffee Prices Expected To Decline

Portland — Coffee prices were due to drop by three cents a pound in most Portland retail outlets today and Thursday in the wake of declines in green coffee market prices.

The price cut would be the first in the Portland area since April 11, with the exception of loss leader quotations. It would put the general prices at 98 cents for vacuum packed tins. Sales leader listings have been about 89 cents a pound.
