Hollywood — London-born Jean Simmons, a hot-house flower of the old world, has been transplanted to western ranch life both in fact and fiction. The little actress is starring in her first western movie and preparing to settle permanently on a 10,000-acre ranch in Arizona with her husband, actor Stewart Granger.

A self-confessed cockney, Jean says being roped into the corral of ranch life suits her fine. "Actually, we have two ranches," she said with a pixie smile. "Sort of a 'his and hers' arrangement. They're 200 miles apart, and we raise cattle on both of them."

"Jimmy (Granger's real first name) bought his 66,000 acres in New Mexico first. It's bigger than Monaco. Cows Must Get Lonely. There are only 800 cows on the ranch (the T&J Brand). They must get terribly lonely out there all by themselves. Three cowboys live on the property on the ranch house. Come to think of it, they must get lonely, too; it's miles away from everything."

"That's why Jimmy bought my ranch (the Yerba Buena). He was afraid the first one would be too isolated for me. My ranch has 500 cows. They don't seem to be as lonely as the others."

"We've had Jimmy's ranch for a year, and mine for seven months. But I've only spent a total of seven weeks out there."

Lawnmower May Ruin Appearance of Lawn

Fargo, N. D. — Don't be too anxious to get behind a lawnmower, advises a North Dakota horticulturist. You may ruin the appearance of the grass.

This may have been what harried husbands have been insisting all along, but Don Hoag, horticulturist for the North Dakota Agricultural college, has provided a scientific explanation.

A lawn's beauty is in the color and texture of the blades of grass, he explained. Close clipping removes most of the green blades.

This exposes the unsightly yellowish stems and gives the lawn a parched, hungry appearance. Taller growth provides shade and lessens direct evaporation of soil moisture.

How often should the grass get a trimming? Hoag said not more than once every week or 10 days. The best rule is to mow whenever the growth is one inch higher than when cut last.

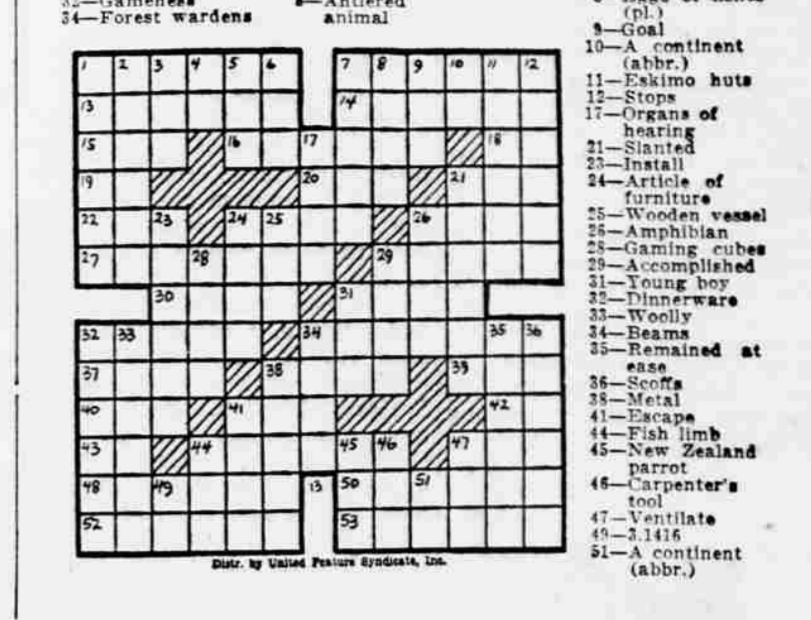

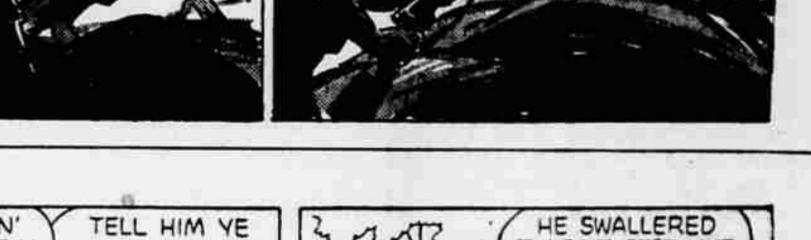
