

Florida Test-Firing of Missiles As Secret as Ostrich in Sand

Cape Canaveral, Fla. — Launching area and by its sound when it zooms into the sky whether it's a Snark, Redstone, Jupiter, Navajo, Thor or a small Bomarc.

Few Secrets

About the only secret kept by officials is whether the test firing is successful. And this is not in doubt when it explodes directly overhead, as the first firing of the Atlas did last June.

Tourists pausing midway down this resort state watch from their second story motel rooms for the crash boats to clear fishing vessels from the waters in front of the launching pads.

Also they look for the tell-tale searchlights that sometimes comb the skies just before the

swoosh of missile drowns out the roaring surf on the beach. A red ball mounted on a 90-foot pole to warn shrimp boats also gives a clue.

The flares are probably the worst-kept secrets on the Defense Department's classified list. Attempts to get simple data on the missile tests released routinely to the public have been in vain.

The situation at the \$335 million installation was best summed up when a sunburned reporter awaiting the firing of the second Atlas called the roll of his fellow newsmen on the beach and concluded: "Everybody is here except a staffer for Tass (the Russian news agency)."

Beach front motels and restaurants are emblazoned with missile-shaped neon signs. A civil group even chose a "Miss Missile." The test center on Cape Canaveral and its headquarters, Patrick Air Force Base—17 miles to the south—employ about 15,000 persons, including one of the largest concentrations of Ph. D.'s in the country.

Some of the employees live on the beaches just a mile or two to the north and south of the concrete-studded firing pads.

Missiles of all shapes and sizes have been whirling down this world's largest test range, which stretches 5,000 miles out over the South Atlantic Ocean. But the big shot everyone is waiting to see is the Atlas, an intercontinental range missile which this country hopes will out-perform Russia's claims for its ICBM.

Despite all attempts by the Pentagon and security officials here most residents second-guess when the launchings are going to take place and beach parties often coincide with the fireworks.

"Old time" missile watchers know by the silhouette and location of the missile on the

Unknown Flu Strain Curtails Activities At Chemawa School

Salem — More than one-third of the students at the Chemawa Indian school just north of here have suffered influenza, according to superintendent Victor E. Hill.

Hill said that in the past two weeks 230 of the 675 students at the Indian school have come down with flu of an unknown strain. He said health authorities are trying to determine if it is the Asian type.

The illness is reported mild in form. But one death has been blamed indirectly on the disease. George McCreath, a student from Indian Wells, Ariz., died Sunday of encephalitis.

Football Games Off

Hill said the Chemawa school's football schedule has been cancelled for the present time until the outbreak of influenza is stemmed.

In Portland, the state board of health announced that reported flu cases in Oregon increased 60 per cent last week to the highest seven-day total recorded so far this year.

Dr. Harold M. Erickson, state health officer, said that no reports were yet available on how many of the cases were on the Asian variety. Dr. Erickson said only 18 cases, confirmed by laboratory tests, have definitely been the Asian variety.

Deaths Could Reach 700

Unconfirmed outbreaks of Asian flu are under investigation by public health officials in several Oregon counties, but Dr. Erickson said it is "too early" to tell if the new disease is building up to a major outbreak in this state.
