

Radio Station to Observe 35th Year At Studio Sunday

Radio station KMED will observe its 35th birthday Sunday, Sept. 29, with a public open house at its Ross Lane studio and transmitter site, according to General Manager Ray Johnson.

Hours for the open house are 1 to 5 p.m. Refreshments will be served. Tours of the studio will be conducted by guides, according to Johnson.

Station KMED was the first station on the air in the Rogue valley, starting its broadcasts in 1922. Studios for the 50 watt station were on West Main st.

General Manager
The late Bill Virgin was general manager of the station which had a total staff of two. The station, then called KFAY, would be on the air each day only as long as advertising, sold each morning would pay for air time.

In 1933 the station's name was changed to KMED and the power boosted to 1000 watts. Several power boosts were made until 1948 when KMED became a 5,000 watt, non-directional station, then the largest of this type between Portland and San Francisco.

The station became an NBC outlet in 1937. In 1950 KMED was sold to the present owners, Radio Medford Inc. The staff now numbers 14.

Lawrence has been in the Denver hospital since about the middle of July. When heart surgery was discussed by doctors, among

them a prominent specialist from London, they were not sure the operation was advisable or that it would help Lawrence.

Undergoes Operation
But Sept. 3 he underwent the operation and it was discovered that two valves of his heart were damaged instead of only one as was previously thought.

One could be repaired. During the next 24 hours he received 20 pints of blood.

He will have to remain in the hospital from three to four weeks more and it will be some time before he will be able to be back at the shop, friends reported.

Maloney Pre-Trial Hearing Continues

Portland — The pre-trial hearing in the conspiracy case against Thomas E. Maloney, Seattle and Spokane race track figure, continued in Circuit Court today.

Circuit Judge Martin Hawkins told Howard Loneragan, Maloney's counsel, Thursday that he would limit the hearing to the defense attack on a half-hour tape recording already produced by the state. He said he would not permit him to bring into the hearing an estimated 80 other tapes.

Two state policemen, Capt. Wayne Gurdane and Lt. Claude Cross, were on the witness stand Thursday. They were questioned about various recordings they had handled and heard.

The defense seeks to suppress the tapes as evidence.

Change in Portland Government Sought

Portland — The Committee for Effective City Government has filed a preliminary petition to change Portland's government to a council-manager form.

If approved then the committee will have to secure 27,307 voters' signatures by Feb. 28 before it can be placed on the May ballot.

Eugene TV Channel For Commercial Use

Washington — The Federal Communications Commission Thursday designated TV channel 9 at Eugene, Ore., for commercial use, effective Oct. 31.

The channel previously had been reserved as an educational outlet.

The commission rejected a proposal to reassign channel 7 the educational channel at Corvallis, Ore., to Eugene-Corvallis for educational use by both cities. It said a construction permit already has been issued to the Oregon State Board of Higher Education for educational station KOAC-TV on the Corvallis channel.

The commission in another action, assigned channel 2 to Portland, Ore., effective Oct. 31. This gives Portland its fifth very high frequency channel. The city now has VHF channels 6, 8, 10, and 12 as well as UHF channels 21 and 27.

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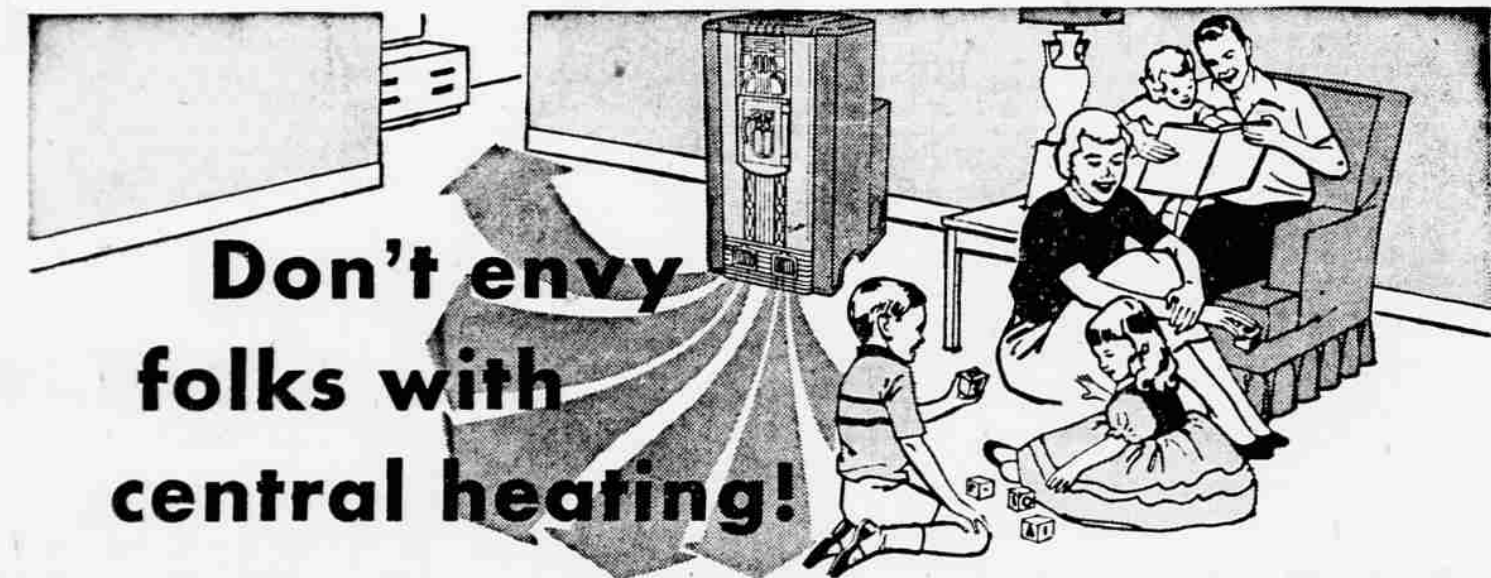

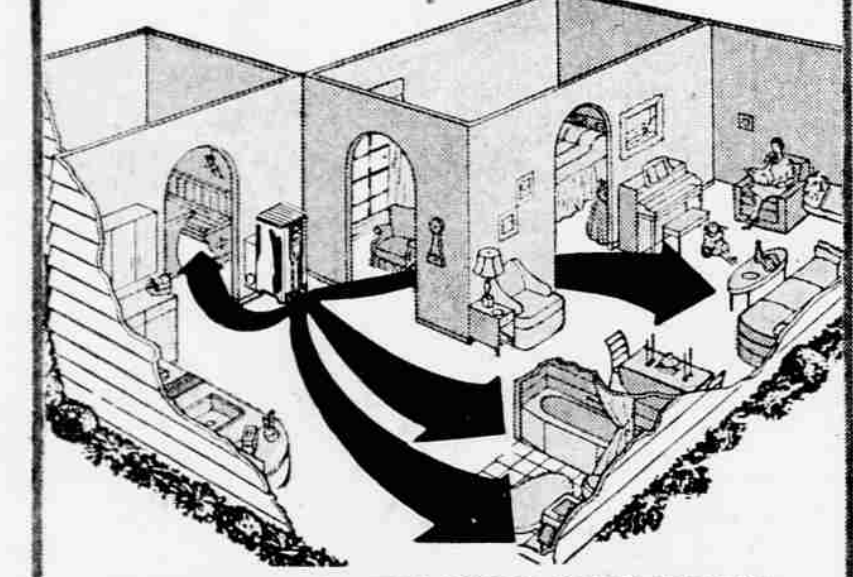
