Midgets
So many have asked me about midgets that I will here suggest that they search for a good-sized book on these interesting little people, called "It is a Small World" (Coward-McCann). It was written by Walter Bodin and Burnet Hershey. They tell hundreds of interesting facts about these little people, who are usually perfectly formed; just small in every dimension.

Midgets are born of normal-sized people. There may be one or two in a family, with the brothers and sisters of normal build. The midgets are of normal (infant) size at birth, but do not grow much. Many stay between three and four feet in height. Some grow another foot or so in their thirties. The smallest midget was a woman who was one foot, nine inches tall, and weighed 22 pounds. One of the smallest men was two feet, two inches tall. Some midgets remain rather infantile all their days, while many are fully developed sexually. Many have married normal-sized people, and have had normal-sized children by them. The midget women naturally run great dangers when they have children because the fetus tends to be of normal size, and has to be delivered by cesarean section.

The midgets commonly earn their living on the stage or in circuses. Some are good dancers and singers, and some are good musicians. Some of these little people tend to age earlier than normal people do, but a few have lived past 70.

The fact that the women can menstruate and bear children suggests strongly that their defect is not in their glands of internal secretion (except for the growth hormone). Some work by Dr. Herbert Evans indicated that if these midgets could be injected with enough of

the growth hormone from the pituitary gland, situated below the brain, they might grow to be much taller.

The Recovery Room

Today, in more and more hospitals, a patient who has just been operated on is not sent back to his room because there, while perhaps he is alone, he might get into some serious difficulty. In the "recovery room" an expert physician and expert nurses are always on hand, watching and ready to meet any emergency that may arise. The idea looks like such a good one I imagine soon every first-class hospital in the world will have a "recovery room."

Dr. Alvarez hopes his readers understand that it would be impossible for him to answer requests for information or to attempt to diagnose by mail.

Globe Said Least Used School Tool
Chicago — Teachers don't know how to use the world globe to give their pupils an understanding of earth science, the chief map editor of Rand McNally and company says.

Dr. Carl Mapes complained that the globe is one of the least used tools in geography and science classrooms.

"Teachers today know less about globes than did the teachers of a century or two ago," Mapes said. "The teachers themselves admit they don't use the globe as much as they should simply because they don't know how to use it."

What's more, added Mapes, no adequate manuals in the use of the globe exist today. He said he had to study old textbooks and manuals of the 17th and 18th centuries to acquire a working knowledge of what can be done with a globe.

Sebastopol Must Wait To Move Rail Line
Sebastopol, Calif. — The din and clatter of the Petaluma and Santa Rosa railroad, a Redwood Empire short line, disturbs some citizens of Sebastopol, in the heart of northern California.

The rail line runs right down the main street of the town. Leonard Arnett, chairman of Sebastopol's planning commission, wants the transportation company to pick up its roadbed and go elsewhere.

"Sebastopol," he complained, "is the only city in the United States that has freight cars going down its main street."

The rail line, under a franchise granted by the city, has this right-of-way until 1968.

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
