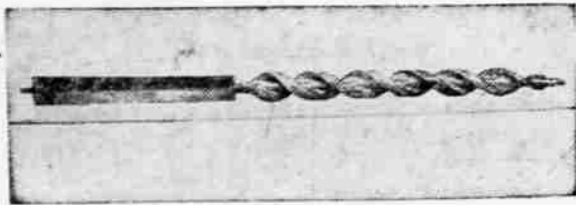


This Week's HISTORY MYSTERY



Can You Identify This Object?

CLUE: This mystery object came from the borders of Old Oregon. It is from one of the Blackfoot Indians' sacred medicine bundles which the Blackfoot believe was given them by the Thunder Spirit. The bundle is opened at the first sound of thunder in spring, this item is taken out and used to make medicine.

ANSWER: This is a ceremonial pipestem. The medicine man removes it from the medicine bundle, points it toward the approaching storm and prays that thunder will not harm anyone. The stem is considered the most sacred and important object in the bundle. It is often not perforated, frequently without a bowl, and in any case, rarely actually smoked.

Anti-Communists Hold Celebration In San Marino

San Marino — The anti-Communists of San Marino Friday celebrated recognition of their government by the United States and the republic of the South Moluccas.

Christian Democratic leaders gathered in a partly-built iron foundry near the Italian border toasted the two countries with orange juice. The occasion was no less warm because none of them knew what or where the South Moluccas was.

Came in Telegram

Recognition from the South Moluccas, a part of the Indonesian archipelago which claims independence from Indonesia, came in a telegram addressed to "Christian Democratic Government, San Marino Iron Foundry, San Marino."

Recognition by the United States was not so formal but it was just as effective.

U.S. Consul Dale Fisher slogged down the muddy road to the iron works headquarters in his automobile Thursday and handed the Christian Democrats documents relating to the International Atomic Energy Agency statute.

Bypassed Communists

He thus bypassed the Communist government ensconced in the government palace six miles away.

"In effect, this act amounts to U.S. recognition of the provisional government," he told reporters.

The Christian Democrats, spirits still buoyant after three days in the factory headquarters without running water or beds, said all they needed was recognition from a few more governments and they would march up the mountain to take the Communists by storm.

Portland — Edward Harold Conklin, 24, an Air Force staff sergeant, was jailed here Friday as a suspect in the slaying of Patrick A. Leary, 33, another airman stationed at Portland Air Base.

Leary's body was found sprawled near the Sapphire tavern on Northeast Columbia boulevard. Police, summoned by a night watchman at a nearby lumber yard, apprehended Conklin who dropped a .32 calibre Mauser automatic as he attempted to flee.
