A Salt-Poor Diet

Many persons ask me if they should go on sticking to what they call a salt-free diet. Actually, it isn't a salt-free diet; that is very hard to design, and if it could be obtained, it might cause serious illness. Forunately, in most cases, when an effort is made to cut down on the amount of table salt in the diet, what the person gets is a "salt-poor diet." In order to get a largely salt-free diet, the person usually has to go into a hospital under the care of an expert dietitian. Often what is used is the Kemper diet.

So far as I can tell from talking to patients, the craze for a

salt-poor diet which started some years ago, has largely died down. Many of the physicians who, for a while, were prescribing such a diet right and left, apparently did not know that it was tried out around in 1906, and then given up. It was tried again around 1920, and again largely given up.

If a person with a bad heart or bad kidneys is somewhat water-logged, with dropsy and swollen ankles, it can help much to go on a diet poor in table salt. So far as I can tell from reading scores of papers by experts, it is doubtful if the amount of salt-poorness in a diet which a man or woman can obtain at home will lower or cure high blood pressure. Often, all it does is to annoy and depress the patient. People with a mild type of high blood pressure usually don't need much treatment, and get along well without it. A person with a serious type III or type IV high blood pressure has to do something, and he may get much help from going into a hospital and staying for a while on a diet which contains very little table salt. In this way he can get a helpful vacation from his high blood pressure.

I think it unwise to prescribe an unpleasant diet for the average woman of 50 who has a blood pressure of perhaps 180 systolic and almost no symptoms. I have seen hundreds of such women get along beautifully without any treatment at all.

Mrs. L. M.—Frank has chosen a girl from a terrible home. Frank M.—But Yolande is the first to criticize her parents.

Mrs. L. M.—My husband and I are very upset about our boy, Frank, who is on the verge of making a terrible marriage.

Frank is 24 and we thought he had grown up into a fine, intelligent young man. We prided ourselves on having done a good job. We always instilled in our children the importance of choosing a mate who came from as good a home as ours. I don't mean anything snobbish by that. I just mean we feel that a happy home life is everything. I have seen such wrecks come out of unhappy or broken homes.

Well, as fate would have it, Frank has chosen a girl from a miserable home. Her parents have been separated many times. Two of her sisters have made unhappy marriages. A younger brother is just a no-good loafer.

Yolande is pretty, I'll admit, and has a nice way about her, but I'm sure this home life has had a lasting and terrible effect on her. The marriage would be such a mistake.

Frank M.—Yolande's home life sure did have a lasting effect on her. It made her 100 per cent determined to make a happy marriage herself. Yolande is the first one to criticize her parents and her sisters for the messes they made. She has studied all the wrong things they did and is determined to be exactly the opposite.

My parents don't realize that Yolande is not only pretty and has a "nice way" but stands way above the average girl in intelligence and social ability. She has more friends of both sexes than any girl I know and everyone is crazy about her.

Yolande's yearning for a happy, peaceful home makes me so anxious to give it to her. An important start would be to get my parents' acceptance. Yolande now feels they don't like her and she doesn't like to visit my home. She says they'll make trouble for us once we are married. I wouldn't see them if they did.

The Council—The L. M.'s have chosen a reasonably good yardstick for their judgments of possible mates for their children, but they are being a bit too rigid about it. It isn't possible to make a positive evaluation of a home background from the surface look. Some stormy homes have many good forces in them and some seemingly placid ones seethe with hidden poisons.

Besides, many individuals rise above their home backgrounds. These parents ought to try to know Yolande better and judge her on her own merits. It is rather unfair to condemn her unconditionally on the basis of her family background.

On the other hand, Frank should give due consideration to his parents' warning. Yolande may be a superior girl and have a sincere desire to create a better life for herself, but she has not had the intimate experience of living in a happy home.

Much has probably learned from the mistakes of her parents and sisters, but imitation is a powerful force in behavior and it is very difficult to reverse the earliest and deepest patterns.

Yolande shows resentment of both her own parents and Frank's. It is true they probably hurt her, yet it was unwise of her to make an issue of it to Frank. This, plus her anxiety that others could make "trouble" in her marriage, shows her lack of confidence. She may be able to make a good marriage someday but our view is that she isn't ready for it yet.
