American Consumers' Assets Said To Be Ahead of Liabilities

New York — American consumers are well fixed, a survey showed today. Grouped together, what they own as against what they owe puts them more than \$1 trillion in the black.

That's how much their assets exceed their liabilities. In the business world, the excess is called net worth and is one of the key barometers used to measure a corporation's financial health.

Every time business begins to level off some people start worrying about the financial condition of consumers. They fear the nation's Joe Smiths may be too deeply in debt to pay their bills if things slow down.

Matters Well Managed

But the evidence seems to indicate the Joe Smiths have managed their money matters very well.

The National Consumer Finance association has compiled for United Press a unique consumer balance sheet.

Paul L. Selby, executive vice president of the NCF, said this ledger showed that as of June 30, 1957, consumers had total assets (what they owned) of \$1,286,500,000,000 and total liabilities (what they owed) of \$145,500,000,000.

That means that the net worth—or the excess of assets over liabilities—of consumers at mid-year was a whopping \$1,141,000,000,000.

In contrast, the biggest corporation in the world—American Telephone & Telegraph Co.—has total assets of only \$17 billion.

All of the nation's \$81 billion firms combined had assets totaling \$241,447,251,425 at the end of 1956.

Best Money Managers

The big gap between what consumers own and what they owe tends to bear out the statement of many economists that "Americans are the best money managers in the world."

Faubus Visions New Approach To Problem

Little Rock, Ark. — Gov. Orval E. Faubus said Monday that "there is a possibility" of a new approach through the southern governors to getting federal troops withdrawn from Little Rock.

Faubus talked over the integration crisis with five Maryland legislators today.

Faubus said it would "not be proper" for him to talk about the conclusions he and the Maryland legislators reached. But he said he learned last week end that a representative of the southern governors' conference will try to contact him early this week.

Faubus said, "there is a possibility of a new approach." He said he did not know what the approach could be or that the governors are working on anything specific.

Dispute Threatens West Coast Shipping

San Pedro, Calif. — A Southern California official of the International Longshoremen and Warehousemen's Union Monday planned to seek union action to "tie up all West Coast shipping" in the wake of an inter-union war here.

George Kuvakas, Anaheim, Calif., business agent for ILWU Local No. 13, said he would hold a union caucus in Portland today to seek the action over an ILWU dispute with the AFL-CIO Fishermen's unions.

The dispute centered around the AFL-CIO union's acceptance of cannery prices of \$55 a ton for sardines and \$42.50 for mackerel. The ILWU has held out for a price of \$80 a ton for sardines and \$50 a ton for mackerel.

Police posted 107 uniformed officers and 20 plainclothesmen at the wharves, and there were no reports of violence.

San Marino Christian Government Takes Over

San Marino — San Marino's Christian Democratic government took office Monday before a wildly-cheering throng celebrating the end of 12 years of Communist rule.

Frederico Bigli, leader of the Christian Democratic force that won this tiny republic's 11-day bloodless "civil war," led his 30 fellow councilors across the threshold of the government palace.

Little Rock, Ark. — Two of the nine Negroes who integrated Central High school under the bayonets of paratroopers Sept. 25 stayed at home Monday with influenza.
