## Quotes From the News

United Nations—Soviet Foreign Andrei Gromyko, in a letter to the U.N. charging that Turkey was preparing to attack Syria: "It must be recognized that an armed attack on Syria by Turkey, a member of the North Atlantic Bloc (NATO), cannot fail to extend the conflict to other countries."

Jamestown, Va.—Queen Elizabeth, in saying the observance of the 350th anniversary of Jamestown's founding illustrates the saga of the British Commonwealth and the United States: "In essence they are both stories of experiments and adventures in freedom."

Washington—Drs. Robert Jastrow and C. A. Pearse of the Naval Research Laboratory, in a statement saying that Russia's satellite may not last as long as expected:

"... Calculations indicate that at high altitudes the electrical drag substantially increases the resistance of the air to the satellite's motion... lifetime estimates of the USSR satellite may be cut by a factor of two as a result of this effect."

Detroit—Former Defense Secretary Charles E. Wilson, in replying to charges he blocked the U.S. earth satellite project by holding up needed funds:

"... No one close to the project, as far as I know, has said that there was a lack of money."

San Francisco—Vice President Nixon, in blaming Arkansas Gov. Orval E. Faubus for the Little Rock school crisis:

"I'm convinced that he (Faubus) used his power not to carry out the law but to thwart it."

Hollywood—Anna Kashfi, bride of actor Marlon Brando, in a statement aimed at clarifying apparently conflicting reports on her parentage:

"I was born in Calcutta India, to my Indian parents, Devi Kashfi... and Selma Ghose, on Sept. 30, 1934. When I was 16 my mother remarried William Patrick O'Callaghan."

### Brando's Wife Clears Status

Hollywood — The most quoted people in film, "Friends," turned to other sensations today as the furor of the affair Brando died a quick, long-awaited death.

Actress Anna Kashfi, who married Marlon Brando last Friday in nearby Eagle Rock, assured the world that, by golly, she was an Indian from Calcutta after all and put an end to speculation that she was a Wales lass in disguise.

Miss Kashfi and Brando returned from a four-day honeymoon Wednesday and issued a statement — one which the actress assured was going to be her last attempt to clear up the much-discussed question of her parentage.

"I was born in Calcutta, India, to my Indian parents, Devi Kashfi, a civil engineer and architect, and Selma Ghose, on Sept. 30, 1934," she said in a statement.

"When I was 16 my mother remarried William Patrick O'Callaghan. I acquired their name and used it as my legal name on my first trip to England in 1952. I returned to India briefly thereafter and then went back to London. Two years ago I came to this country as a non-immigrant visitor on petition by Loew's, Incorporated."

### Mojave To Lose Marine Activity

Washington — The Navy announced Wednesday that activities at the Marine Corps Auxiliary Air Station to Mojave, Calif., will be shifted to Vincent Air Force Base at Yuma, Ariz.

The Navy said the move would save \$81 million in modernization costs required at Mojave.

It said the Air Force made Vincent available as a result of joint reviews on air field needs which were "conducted in an effort to reduce new construction in the interest of economy."

The Navy expects the transfer to be made in the first half of 1959. Civilian employees will either be transferred or released.

Plans call for the eventual disposal of the Mojave base as an air field, the Navy said.

The Air Force said that its personnel at Vincent will be transferred to other installations. The 4750th Air Defense Wing is now at Vincent, engaged in rocketry training.

### GI Home Loan Boost In Interest Possible

San Francisco — Congressman J. Arthur Younger (R-Cal.), told the closing session of the National Savings and Loan league's fall management Conference Wednesday that Congress would boost GI home loan interest rates next year if veterans indicate they want such action.

Younger said Congress failed to act upon President Eisenhower's request for such a rate increase at the last session largely because of the indifference shown by veterans.

Younger said that "As a result of the low GI interest rate, investment funds have been sharply curtailed for the veterans housing program."

However, he said the American Legion has now urged that the Veterans Administration be given the same discretionary authority to set interest rates as is now given the commissioner of the Federal Housing Administration.
