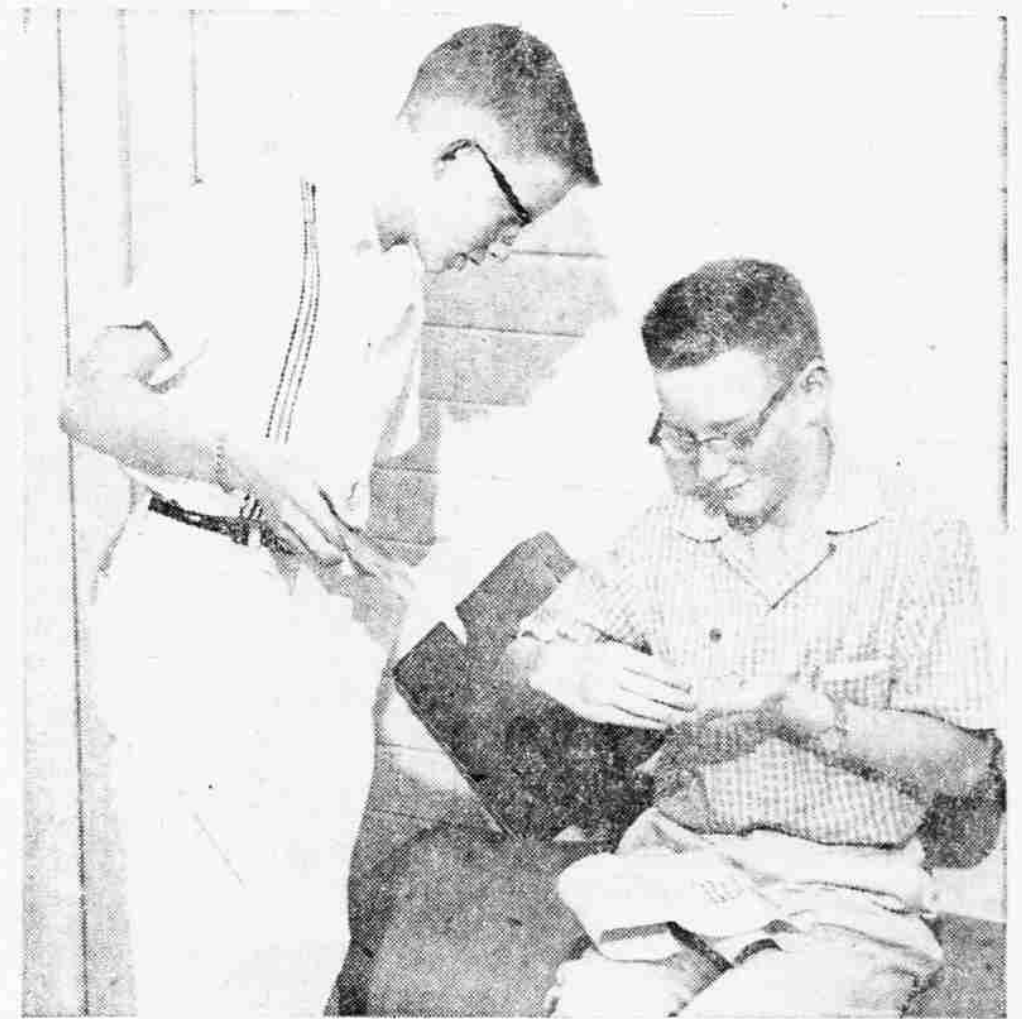


Reporters' School
