Morse Says U. S. Policy Doomed

Chicago — Sen. Wayne Morse (D-Ore.) charged Tuesday that the administration's foreign policy for the Middle East is based on selfishness and hidden from the public by the label "top secret."

Addressing the Women's American Organization for Rehabilitation Through Training, Morse said the United States' foreign policy is based on selfish motives "spelled out in a three-letter word, oil, and is doomed to failure."

"Our money sent to the Middle East is helping the dictators, not the citizens," he said. "We should be loaning money for specific projects to help the peoples of under-developed nations instead of giving large sums to their leaders."

Morse also charged that even the Senate Foreign Relations Committee, of which he is a member, is kept in the dark. "Eighty-five per cent of the documents stamped 'top secret' should be released to the public," he said.

The Family Council

Editor's note: The Family Council consists of a judge, a psychiatrist, three clergymen, a newspaper editor, a woman's editor and two writers. Each article is a summary of an actual report. The Family Council does not give advice; it merely reports on problems that have been dealt with by responsible agencies and counselors.

Jane M. — I'm fed up with the men in our circles.

Kenneth M. — She's a regular prude.

Jane M. — Maybe I'm just a kill-joy as my husband always says, but I must say I'm a little fed up on some of the things that go on in our circle of friends.

When we get together in an evening, the men band into one section of the room and start telling stories, punctuated regularly by hearty guffaws. If a woman wanders over to their territory, silence immediately descends, or her husband is delegated to deport her back to women's territory.

If we all go to a movie, or watch something on TV, the men go in for all kinds of cracks about the buxom star and make slighting remarks about their wives — sometimes in the hearing of children.

What I can't understand is this: If these men are so crazy about women that they have to talk about them all the time, how come they don't pay any attention to us?

Kenneth M. — Jane's complaints are just typically Jane. She has never been able to see the boys cutting up, having a little innocent fun without pursing up her mouth and walking off like a regular prude. She's been that way ever since I've known her — which goes back to teenage.

What I'd like to know is what does she expect us to do, anyway, while she and the girls swap recipes, talk about baby foods, hairdos and the lengths of skirts. It seems to me they sound a heck of a lot worse with their tittering over something

one of the kids said. Half the time when I ask Jane to explain what she finds so funny or so interesting in something, she'll answer, "Oh a man can't understand anyway."

The way I see it, almost every subject is taboo. If we talk politics, we get into a fight and the girls don't like that either. Freedom of speech—haw, haw!

The Council: Has anyone here read any good books lately? It sounds as though this little circle of friends is bored stiff. Both men and women need the stimulation of a few intellectual interests. This won't come to them. They'll have to go out and find them.

A civic organization or a church or social group in the neighborhood may be offering courses or a series of lectures. Someone ought to investigate to see what is available.

If there is nothing at hand, this group ought to take the initiative in setting something up. They may find they can even invite lecturers for small gatherings. Perhaps they can learn to discuss politics without "getting into a fight."

Usually the men leave it to the women to set the tone of social gatherings. If the women offer nothing the men can enjoy, they will naturally seek their own amusements. If they descend to an adolescent level, it simply reflects the poverty of their adult mental lives.

Jane should realize that "pursing up her mouth and walking off like a regular prude" may give her a feeling of self-righteousness, but does nothing to help the situation. She must contribute more than criticism to make things better.
