Willamette, CI Collide In NW Loop

Willamette and Linfield meet tough opponents Saturday in the Northwest conference football race.

Willamette goes up against College of Idaho at Caldwell Saturday afternoon. The Coyotes are 2-0 in the league and a win over the Bearcats would establish them as the biggest threat to Linfield's title.

Linfield, 2-0, meets Whitman at McMinnville Saturday night at 8:30 p.m. in its homecoming game. The other league game matches Pacific and Lewis and Clark in Portland Saturday afternoon.

Biggest OCC contest is at Ashland where contenders SOC and OCE battle it out. Portland State meets Eastern Oregon in La Grande while Oregon Tech hosts Dixie J.C. of Utah in a non-conference game.

Spartan Backs Keep Leadership

Chicago — Michigan State's star backs retained the lead in Big Ten statistics this week, even though Purdue upset the Spartans Saturday.

At the same time, Michigan State became the league leader on both offense and defense. Ohio State and Iowa, tied for the league lead, were running second and third in each department as well.

Halfback Walt Kowalczyk of Michigan State retained first place in rushing with 229 yards gained, but he has played in three games compared to two for runner-up Don Clark of Ohio State, who has gained 214 yards.

Jim Ninowski of Michigan State and Tom Haller of Illinois ran one-two in both passing and total offense. Ninowski has passed for 375 yards and has a total offense gain of 346 yards, compared to passing gains of 306 and total of 307 for Haller. But Haller, too, has played in only two games against three for Ninowski.

Colorado Buffaloes Gunning For Biggest Upset of Season

The University of Colorado Buffaloes, who almost buffaloed the national college football champions over Oklahoma last year, try again Saturday in one of the leading games nationally.

Then, as now, Oklahoma was ranked No. 1 by the United Press Board of Coaches. Then, as now, Colorado's ground attack, speed and bench strength made it a heavy favorite. But Colorado's crunching running game rolled up 191 yards and a 19-6 lead by half time, only to have Oklahoma's superior depth pay off in a 27-19 victory.

Although Oklahoma is a 27-point favorite this time, Colorado again has that striking power to rank first in the nation in rushing — 333 yards per game — an third in total offense — 431 yards per game.

Still, Oklahoma figures to check the Buffs with a defense that has held the opposition to only 101 yards a game rushing, fifth best in the country.

Duke Rated For Bowl

An Oklahoma victory would be its 45th straight and would all but assure the Sooners of another Big Eight championship plus an Orange Bowl trip. The other Orange Bowl team probably will be the winner of the Saturday game between Duke and North Carolina State, the only unbeaten in the Atlantic Coast Conference. Duke is a seven-point choice.

In other Saturday headlines, second-ranked Iowa, versatile enough to rank first nationally in both total offense and rushing defense, is favored by 16 points over Northwestern; third-ranked Texas A & M is an eight-point choice over Baylor, a major hurdle in the Aggies' quest for

the Southwest Conference title and a Cotton Bowl berth; and Oregon, best bet for the role of Rose Bowl host, rates seven points over California.

The Oklahoma-Colo and Duke-North Carolina State games will be televised regionally. So will Michigan at Minnesota, Washington State at Southern California and Penn State at Syracuse. The favorites are Michigan by five points, Washington State by one and Syracuse by six.

Miami Oyer Kansas

In the only major game Friday night, Miami of Florida, with a disappointing 1-2 record so far, is a 14-point choice over Kansas. The collegiate week end actually started Thursday when Clemson, led by sophomore quarterback Harvey White, rolled to a 13-0 upset victory over South Carolina in their annual state fair tussle at Columbia, S.C.
