Miss Grant had never seen the home she was to share with Crosby when she stepped off the plane at the local airport after a flight from Nevada.

As she stood aside and waited as friends loudly greeted Crosby, a photographer yelled: "Would you move forward, Mrs. Crosby?"

"Say that again," the petite actress smiled.

The couple's marriage came as a surprise to friends and relatives, and it was a hurried decision for themselves, too.

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Residents Warned About Unscrupulous Promoters Who Try to Reach Investors

Don McNeil, manager of the Jackson County Chamber of Commerce, warned residents of Jackson county today about a small group of unscrupulous promoters who attempt to reach gullible investors through innuendo - appearing business opportunity ads.

The chamber manager emphasized that only a small proportion of business opportunity advertising offered to newspapers is of a questionable nature, and the vigilance of classified advertising departments further reduces the proportion of such advertisements that ever find their way into print.

These columns have become one of the most popular features of the modern newspaper," McNeil stated. "Thousands of successful business ventures have had their inceptions in a small classified business opportunity advertisement."

Important Facts

But the chamber executive stated that, in order to assure full satisfaction, prospective investors should be aware of certain important facts which will help them to guard against offers of dubious merit.

"For example," he said, "the experience of Better Business Bureaus and Chambers of Commerce throughout the country indicates that certain business opportunity offers involving the purchase by the investor of vend-

ing machines, food - warming equipment and greeting cards racks have been of a highly questionable nature, and have resulted in substantial losses to many investors."

The chamber executive urged caution in entering into propositions of this type, and suggested consultation with the Chamber of Commerce.

Points which should be considered, McNeil said, include:
