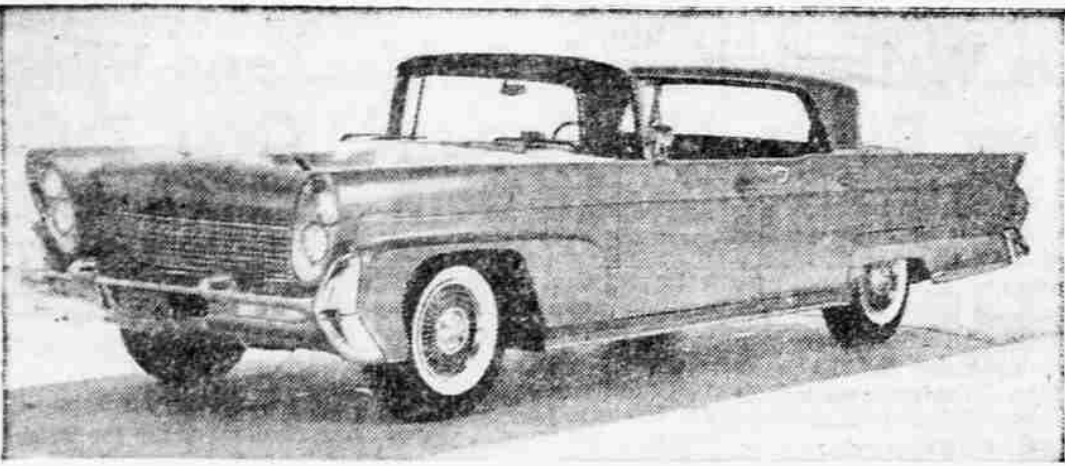

Ike Ready To Launch Crusade To Reawaken America To Science

Washington — President Eisenhower is ready to launch a great crusade to reawaken America to science.

If he follows the plan of his scientific advisers, this will mean mobilizing the entire nation—the federal government, states, local communities and the average citizen—to a new concentration on scientific learning and achievement.

Just how much the Chief Executive will reveal of the actual U.S. position in the science-weapon race with Russia apparently is still undecided. Vannevar Bush, head of the World War II government Science Office under which the atom bomb was developed, called Wednesday for a "real awakening" to the Russian challenge and said "the whole story hasn't been told."

Flu Death Rate Tapering Off

The death rate from flu and its complications showed signs of tapering off today despite severe outbreaks in scattered parts around the country.

The United Press counted a total of 462 deaths blamed on flu and complications since last summer when Asian flu first appeared in the United States. The total on Monday stood at 448.

The toll of states showed New York with 126 flu-caused fatalities, Pennsylvania 84, Michigan 37, California 34, Illinois, Louisiana and Ohio 21 each, Wisconsin 17, Iowa and Washington 15 each, Utah 11, Colorado 10, Hawaii 9, Kentucky and Indiana 8 each, Connecticut 7, New Jersey, Tennessee and Oregon 3 each, Minnesota and Nebraska 2 each, and 1 each in Arizona, Missouri, Oklahoma and the District of Columbia.

Flu reached epidemic proportions in 62 of Kentucky's 102 counties, forcing additional schools to close in Wolfe, Ohio and Harlan counties.

Steeves and Wife Are Reconciled

Bridgeport, Conn. — Lt. David Steeves, the flier who spent a 54-day ordeal of cold and hunger in the California Sierra after he bailed out of his jet plane, announced Wednesday he will not have to go through a second ordeal—divorce.

Steeves said his wife, Rita, had decided not to divorce him and they have reconciled. He also announced he has asked for his release from active duty in the Air Force.

The 23-year-old airman was on leave from Craig Air Force Base, Selma, Ala., when announcement of the reconciliation was made in his behalf by Redbook magazine, which will carry the story of his survival in the mountains in its January issue.

Steeves said he would make no comment on the fact his story of his survival had been questioned. He said that "anyone interested in knowing the truth can find it in Redbook."

He first contracted with the Saturday Evening Post to publish his account of how he survived the ordeal after his jet trainer exploded last spring. But the magazine said it found a "number of discrepancies" in Steeves' story, and cancelled the contract Aug. 13.

Warming Trend In New England

A warming trend over most of the nation spread into New England today, accompanied by showers throughout much of the East.

The coolest region in the country overnight was the Upper Mississippi Valley north to Lake Superior where readings skidded into the 30s.

Overnight temperatures in the 50s were common along the Eastern Seaboard, the gulf, the desert Southwest and most of California. Elsewhere, readings got no lower than the 40s.

The main band of rain Wednesday night occurred over the Eastern Great Lakes and south through Northern Georgia. However, amounts were generally light. Showers and somewhat cooler temperatures also invaded the North Pacific Coast.

Generally cloudy skies and occasional rain is predicted today for the Great Lakes, the Ohio Valley, and the Eastern Seaboard from Maine to the Carolinas.

Showers also are expected in the Pacific Northwest, the desert Southwest and Southern California. Partly cloudy weather will prevail elsewhere.

Cooler temperatures are expected to sweep the Northern Plains, the Northern Rockies and the North Pacific Coast.

Absenteeism Closes Astoria High School

Astoria — Astoria high school was closed today when absenteeism blamed on "respiratory infections" reached 47 per cent of the student body of 735.

The three grade schools in the city remained open with absenteeism running about 20 per cent, school officials said. While Clatsop county has had no confirmed cases of Asian flu, it was believed that the illnesses were of that nature.

All Knappa schools were closed Monday for the entire week because of 25 per cent absenteeism while other schools in the county reported about 15 per cent of their students absent.
