

Zhukov Said Fired Because Khrushchev Feared 'Bonapartism'

London—P—Marshal Georgi Zhukov was fired as Soviet defense minister because party chief Nikita S. Khrushchev feared he was trying to become another Napoleon Bonaparte, reports from Moscow said today.

Western diplomatic and Communist press sources in close touch with Moscow said Zhukov shortly would be accused publicly of "Bonapartism," something akin to the "personality cult" with which Khrushchev regarded the late Josef Stalin.

In essence, it means Khrushchev feared Zhukov as head of the army was growing more powerful than Khrushchev as head of the party, diplomats said.

The Red army resumed its rehearsals in downtown Moscow Wednesday night for the 40th anniversary parade celebrating the Bolshevik Revolution Nov. 7.

They were the first held since Zhukov's dismissal was announced, indicating Khrushchev felt he had won a complete victory over Zhukov and did not fear repercussions from the army.

Communist press sources said the meeting of the 133-member party Central Committee which discussed the Zhukov ouster had ended.

There was no official confirmation of this by Western correspondents who are working under heavy censorship in Moscow.

The Italian Communist newspaper "L'Unita" first used the word "Bonapartism" in a dispatch from Moscow's sudden demotion. Then Western diplomatic sources in close touch with Moscow said the same thing.

Moscow Radio indicated some concern today that some Soviet soldiers had a closer allegiance to the army than the party.

It broadcast an article from "Red Star," the Red army publication, urging all unit commanders and political commissars in the army and navy to rally troops more closely around the party.

In Paris, the French Communist daily "Humanite" insisted that whatever the Soviet Communist Party had decided to do about Zhukov it had decided wisely.

London's Communist Daily Worker ignored the Zhukov affair completely today.

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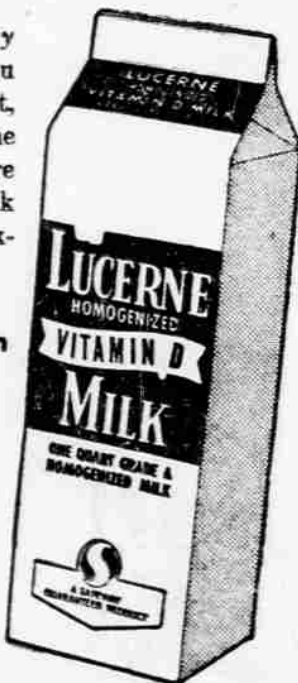
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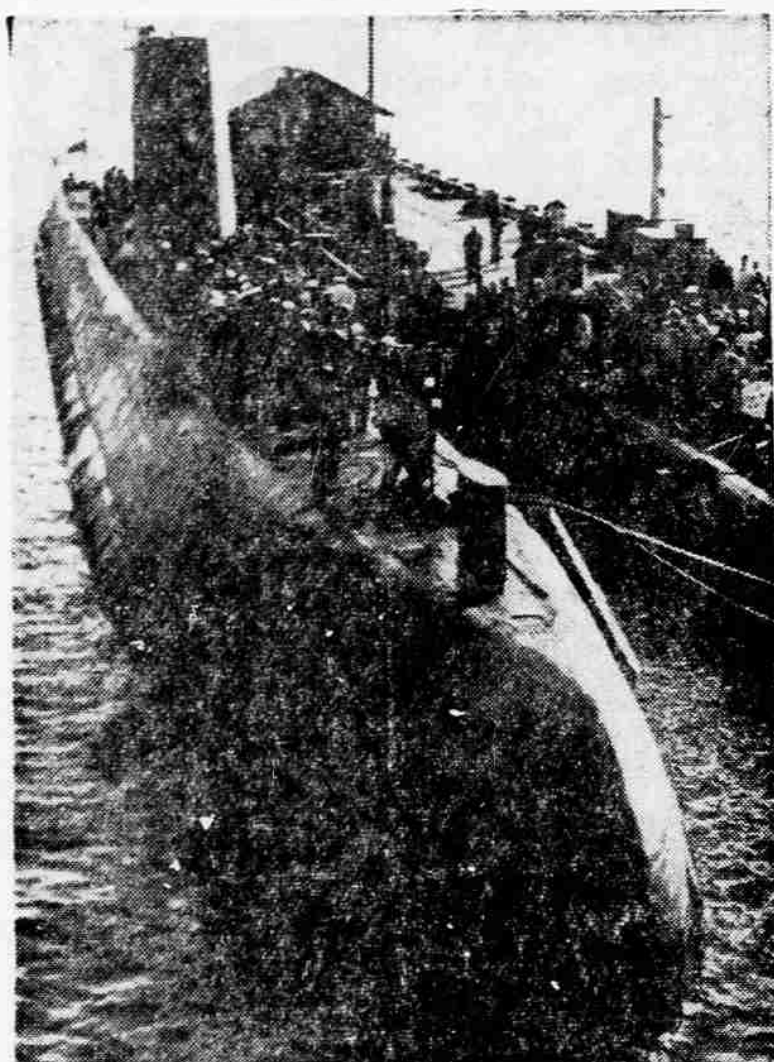

Indictment Charges Conspiracy To Fix Portland Milk Prices

Portland — P — A federal grand jury returned an indictment Wednesday charging several concerns with conspiracy to fix milk prices in the Portland market area.

The indictment named the Oregon Milk Distributors, Arden Farms company, Dairy Co-operatives, Inc., Damascus Milk Company, Farmers' Dairy association, Safeway Stores, Inc., Sunnyside Farms Milk and Ice Cream company, and Sunshine Dairy.

All of the firms named in the indictment have headquarters in Portland except Safeway, headquartered in Oakland, Calif. and Arden Farms, headquartered in Los Angeles.

Charges Listed
The indictment charged that the defendants and other persons engaged in the distribution of milk in the Portland marketing area "have agreed to fix prices paid to producers for raw milk, to fix distributors' prices for bottled milk and other fluid milk products, to establish non-competitive quantity discounts for bottled milk and to restrict and eliminate competition among distributors in the sale and distribution of bottled milk and other fluid products."

The indictment came after an investigation which started last April.

U. S. District Judge William

East ordered summonses served on the defendant concerns, instead of the customary warrants of arrest. No bail was required. He set date for arraignments for Nov. 22.

Milk Cost Said Low

William Lubersky, attorney for Oregon Milk Distributors association, said he was shocked at the indictment "because the milk industry in the Portland area pays the highest price to the farmer of any major market on the West Coast."

"The milk distributors of the Portland area are not guilty of any violations of federal anti-trust laws, conspiracy to fix prices or conspiracy to do anything else," Lubersky said.

He said the cost of milk to families of the Portland area is the lowest of any major city on the coast.

LAW CLAMP-DOWN

Johannesburg, South Africa — The South African government has moved to institute the death penalty in cases of armed robbery, it was reported today. Justice Minister C. Swart said in an address that the cabinet had agreed to introduce legislation to this effect. The move coincided with a crime wave in Johannesburg, highlighted by a number of spectacular payroll robberies by armed gangs in recent days.

Diane Hank's Mother To Return To Stand

Portland — P — Mrs. Agnes Hank, mother of 16-year-old Diane Hank found dead more than three years ago, was scheduled to return to the witness stand today as the state attempted, for the fourth time, to prove that Sherry Fong killed the girl.

Mrs. Hank testified Wednesday that the last time she saw her daughter alive was about 7:15 a.m. Jan. 6, 1954, when the girl left for school.

Mrs. Fong, whose husband, Wey Him Fong, was freed on a directed verdict in a separate trial, was composed Wednesday as a parade of state's witnesses testified—often over the objections of John P. Hannon defense attorney.

Witnesses said the hbody was found trussed inside two tattered blankets and a stained, moldy sheet on Feb. 26, 1954 along the Evergreen highway about three miles east of Washougal, Wash.

Gary Kapp Leads Ends

New York — P — Gary Kapp, a junior end listed in the Utah State football brochure as "very strong defensively" today is the nation's leading flanker offensively.

The 181-pound native of Ogden, Utah has caught 30 passes for 464 yards and four touchdowns in six games for a slight lead over Utah's Stu Vaughan, who has caught 28 passes for 363 yards and two touchdowns. Fred Dugan of Dayton is third with 26 catches, 389 yards and two touchdowns.

Dave Sherer of Southern Methodist is the country's leading punter with an average of 45 yards for 15 tries. Kirk Wilson of UCLA ranks second with a 44.6 average.
