

Mrs. Christensen Named Chairman of AFS Group in Area

Mrs. Holger Christensen of Medford has been named general chairman of the American Field Service international scholarship committee, according to an announcement by AFS area representative, Mrs. Doris Dickenson, of Yreka, Calif.

Mrs. Christensen will coordinate activities of the AFS in this area and supervise the foreign student program. She will also work with school officials and community groups in selection of a boy or girl to take part in the "summer program" of local students who spend two months with families overseas.

Other members named to the committee include finance, Wel-

don Kline; home placement, Mrs. Frank Bash; school liaison, Leonard Mayfield; summer program and projects, Les Harris and David Frohnmayer; publicity, Russ Jamison.

Studying in U.S.
Mrs. Christensen noted that under the AFS program 1,039 foreign students representing 29 different countries are studying in the United States this year. In addition, this past summer, 748 American boys and girls were able to spend the summer abroad.

The Medford Rotary club has sponsored a foreign student for the past two years and sent one local student abroad last summer, Mrs. Christensen reported.

She added that the committee would like to see the program expanded in this area and is anxious to contact groups or clubs who are interested in sponsoring a student.

Program committee chairman of local clubs who are interested in arranging for a talk by the AFS student from Sweden, Miss Margareta Larsson-Aulin, may contact Mrs. Christensen or the committee.

Suit Filed in Court Seeking \$4,500

Mrs. Leona A. Scott, Los Angeles, Calif., is seeking \$4,500 plus six per cent interest from Arthur G. Elliott, Grants Pass, according to a suit now on file in the Jackson county clerk's office.

The annual interest is to be paid from Sept. 11, 1956, until all of the \$4,500 is received, according to the complaint.

Elliott was given power of attorney of about 51 shares of com-

mon stock in Sequin, Inc., on May 22, 1956 by the plaintiff, according to the complaint. The Sequin then owned and operated a night club under the name of Stan's Y club at 1909 North Pacific highway.

Acting in his capacity as pow-

er of attorney, Elliott, with other stockholders of Sequin, Inc., sold all outstanding capital stock, including Mrs. Scott's to Ira S. Hall, Dean Woolley and Donald Adams, the complaint shows. Total purchase price was \$9,000 of which \$4,500 was received

for the plaintiff's 51 shares of stock, it is alleged in the complaint. The complaint states further that Elliott refused to pay \$4,500 to Mrs. Scott upon request.

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New York—Dr. Richard C. Hubley, 31, leader of a four-man party of scientists encamped for the winter on McCall Glacier in the Brooks Range of Alaska, died of apparent exposure Monday, according to word received here.

Arguments Completed In Maloney Hearing

Portland—The Thomas E. Maloney conspiracy case was ready for submission to the jury today after instructions by Circuit Judge Martin Hawkins.

Closing arguments were completed Wednesday, and Judge Hawkins told the jury: "This case will be submitted to you in the morning."

Maloney is accused of conspiring in 1955 and the early part of 1956 with William M. Langley, then district attorney, and Joseph P. McLaughlin, Seattle cardroom operator, in an alleged

plot to control gambling in Portland.

London — Russia today claimed a world record for a new helicopter which is said to be capable of carrying up to 80 persons. Moscow Radio said the helicopter, described as the first to be powered by two turbo-propeller engines, carried a record payload of 26,463 pounds to an altitude of 7,870 feet. The broadcast heard here said the craft also can be used to transport tractors, bulldozers and other equipment.



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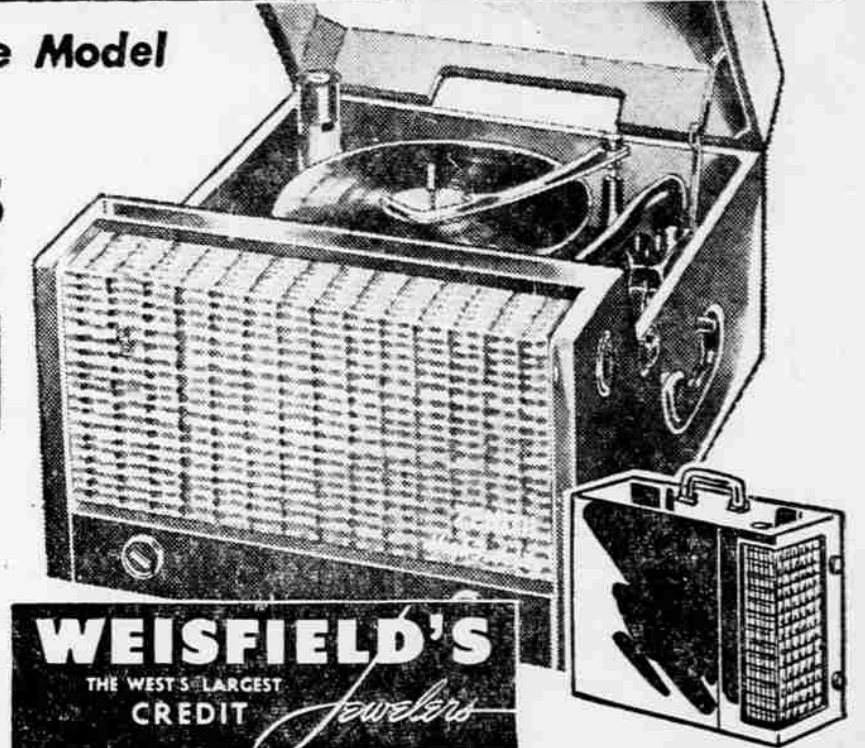
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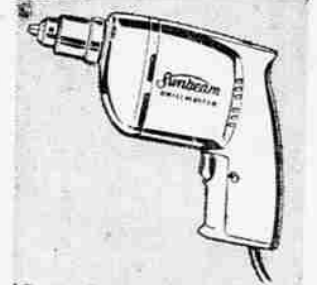
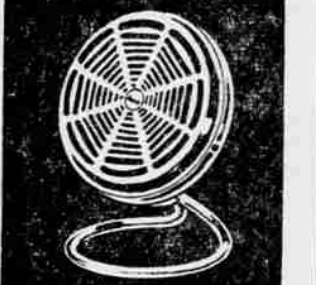
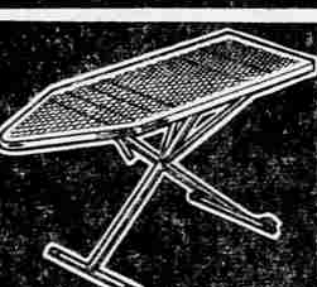
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
