Ike's Ex-Aide Said Paid by Dave Beck

Washington — Merly S. Pitzele, labor advisor to President Eisenhower in the 1952 campaign, testified today in chambers President Dave Beck once paid him \$15,000 for "advice" on how to run the union.

He said the money was paid him through Nathan W. Shefferman, labor relations consultant and Beck's personal friend.

Pitzele, who was also chairman of the New York Mediation Board for some of his time on the Beck-Shefferman payroll, told the Senate Rackets Committee he quit his advisory role in 1953 "when I had my belly full" of the "festering" corruption he found in the teamsters.

Pitzele has been labor editor of Business Week magazine since 1941. He served as a labor advisor to New York Gov. Thomas E. Dewey in the 1944 and 1948 presidential campaigns.

In 1955 he traveled on the Eisenhower campaign train and contributed to Eisenhower speeches on labor.

Highway Commission Approves Budget

Portland — A budget of \$87,589,000 for highway construction and maintenance was approved here Thursday by the State Highway Commission.

Of the total, fifty million dollars will go for construction and right of way purchase and the balance will go for maintenance and engineering. Federal contributions will amount to 39 million dollars.

Highway Bids Total Over \$1 Million

Portland — The State Highway Commission Thursday opened bids totaling more than \$1 million on a project to widen the Columbia River highway between Troutdale and Rooster Rock State Park to four lanes.

Bids submitted were for grading only. Paving projects will come later after grading is completed late next summer. Apparent low bidders on the project were R. A. Heintz Construction Co., Portland, \$531,217 for the west unit, and S. W. Groesbeck, Eugene, \$689,445 for the east unit.
