Hollywood — "What have you got against television?" No, not you—me. What I mean is, this is the question that I am asked most frequently nowadays. Because I don't appear on television, most everyone I know seems to think I must bear some deep-seated grudge against the medium.

Actually I have nothing against television. I watch it all the time.

But I don't want to be seen on it. And I have a lot of reasons. As a matter of fact, I could write a book about it. Oh, I know, you have seen me on television—the Edward R. Murrow program, "The Secret Life of Danny Kaye," the one about UNICEF and the children all over the world.

Was on Film

But that wasn't what I would really call appearing on television. It was a filmed record of a trip I made around the world for the UN Children's Fund, not a "show" as an entertainer.

Why don't I make that kind of an appearance? For one thing, I enjoy my life very much the way it is. I like making motion pictures. I enjoy making the stage appearances I do. I get a great thrill from my work for UNICEF.

But I can't do all this and television, too.

May Appear Later

In television, it's possible to take a complete unknown, surround him with top creative talent, money and make him a national rage in a household word. If this holds true, it also must follow that in the same amount of time, television can destroy him.

Gas Truck Overturns Near Portland Bridge

Portland — A truck loaded with 7500 gallons of gasoline overturned near the Ross island bridge here Tuesday and the gasoline caught fire, starting a three-alarm blaze.

The driver, Oliver Wendell Holmes, 46, escaped serious injury. He kicked out the windshield and scrambled up a bank just as the fire broke out. He suffered hand cuts.

The spectacular flames brought out 80 firemen and 20 pieces of equipment. Firemen managed to keep the flames away from nearby buildings but the gasoline still was burning some two hours later.

Bonn to End Payments

Bonn, Germany — West Germany will end its contribution to the cost of allied troops stationed in this country next March 31, a foreign office spokesman said today. The spokesman added, however, that under the North Atlantic Treaty, nations with troops stationed in West Germany could seek bilateral negotiations with Bonn over support costs after that date.

Meat Preservation Patent Now Public

Columbus, Ohio — An Ohio State University scientist who recently patented a new formula for preserving meat without refrigeration has turned his method over to the people of the United States.

Dr. Fred E. Deatherage, chairman of the agricultural biochemistry at Ohio state, spent several years experimenting with various methods before he formulated a system of introducing antibiotics into meat before and after slaughter.

After Dr. Deatherage was granted a U.S. patent on the economical meat preserving process, he assigned it to the state of Ohio "for the free use of the people of the United States."

Minnesota Farms Increase in Size

Minneapolis — The size of Minnesota farms has increased nearly one per cent between 1955 and 1956, according to extension agricultural economists at the University of Minnesota.

The average farm size in 1955 was 203 acres and in 1956, 203.1 acres. The trend has been fairly steady throughout the state.

The size of farms has grown steadily since 1946 when the average acreage was 182.9.
