A group studying the current year's interdenominational home mission study "Christ, the Church and Race" will hold its second session in the library room of First Methodist church at 5:30 p.m., Sunday, November 10. The Rev. George Trobough will present "the involvement of local churches."

This study course will continue for six Sunday sessions under the leadership of the Rev. Mr. Trobough, who is cooperating with the Woman's Society of Christian Service in presenting the course. The text being used is titled "The Kingdom Beyond Caste" which was written by Liston Pope, dean of Yale University Divinity school.

Consideration is given to such basic questions as: What are the housing and employment opportunities for Negroes and other minority groups? Is it true, as has been charged, that the hour between eleven and twelve on Sunday morning is the most segregated hour of the week? The film titled "Prejudice" will be shown during the coming study hour.

The study group is open to both men and women. Interested persons from all churches are invited to attend and to participate in the sessions.

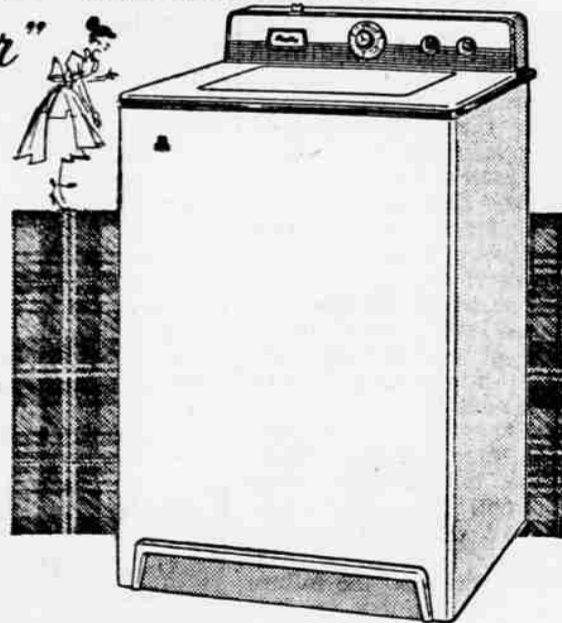

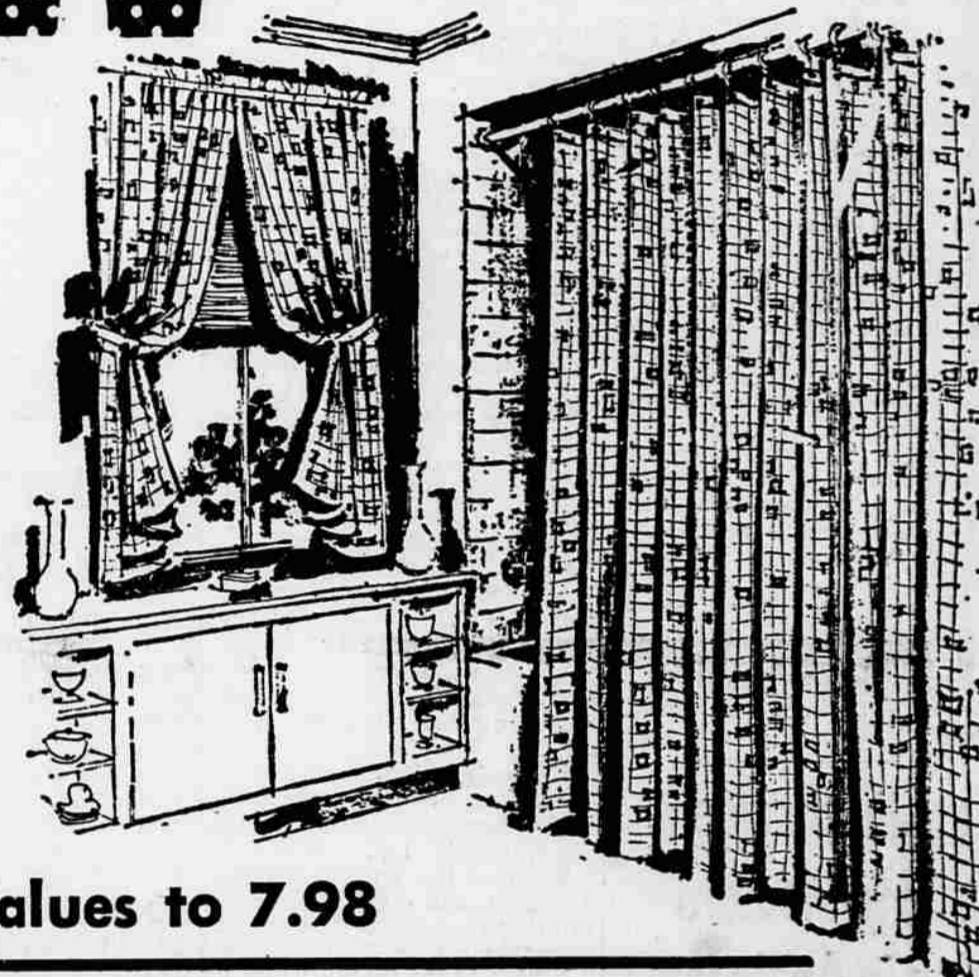
