Hollywood—As we were riding in from a "Wyatt Earp" location the other day, one of the boys on the bus wished he had a wealthy relative who would die and leave him a fortune.

As we all got to speculating about the pleasure of being heirs, some one suggested that in a way, all 40 of us in the company had received a common inheritance—from Wyatt Earp.

"Look," this chap began, "I've never had a relative die and leave me money, but I feel old Wyatt left me more in cash than I could reasonably expect from a close ancestor."

'Bequest' Explained
He went on to point out that since "The Life and Legend of Wyatt Earp" started on ABC-TV, he had had steady work in his field of sound technician, and he'd kept groceries on the table at home, clothed his wife and two kids and put a buck or two in the savings account as well.

"If my grandfather, who was about Wyatt's age," he pointed

out, "wanted to leave me an amount equal to what I've earned from work on this show, he'd have had to have been a lot wealthier than he was."

Like the rest of the company, I hadn't thought of Wyatt as a man who had left me the equivalent of a cash inheritance, but it's true.

In fact, a man who died in 1929, the year Wyatt died, would have had to leave an heir more than \$3 million to bequeath an income such as I've enjoyed from playing Earp on television. Of course, in Earp's day you didn't need that much money. For instance, Wyatt bought his tailor-made suits for around \$25. His custom-made shirts cost him around \$2.50 each.

However, if it would have taken a fortune of more than \$3 million just to account for the income I've derived from playing Earp, think how much it would have taken to provide the incomes others have received because of their work on our series.
