

Black Tornado To Bid at Beaverton Saturday for State Semi-final Spot

A 35-man squad of Medford high football players will leave Saturday morning to make the Black Tornado's fourth consecutive bid in Oregon Class A-1 play-off semi-finals. They play at Beaverton at 8 p.m. tomorrow and have the role of underdog in their engagement with the District 3 champions.

Despite the troubles encountered in concluding the Southern Oregon conference and District 6 campaigns, there's confidence in the Medford camp that the Tornado can hit the stride of its Crater and Klamath Falls games and roar past the favored Metropolitan leaguers into the semi-finals against the Portland city titlists.

This feeling has stemmed from good workouts through this week on the Tornado practice field. Preparations for the Metro beavers hit their peak with a "real good" drill under lights last night.

Pass Defense

Coach Fred Spiegelberg made the foregoing characterization of practice after he and his aides put the Tornado through its paces from 6:30 to 8:15 p.m. Quite a bit of pass defense was on the evening agenda as the Medfordites worked to strengthen one of the phases of the game in which they have been hurting this season.

Afternoon drill today was to wind up the week's work except for the pre-game warm-up. The work was to include kick-off coverage and returns, punt protection and signal drill.

In commenting on the physical condition of the Medford squad, Spiegelberg said that he would not start Guard Tom Merton and Halfback Johnny Jones, both of whom are hobbling from twisted ankles. He indicated that their

service will be limited. Jones was on hand and limping last night and Merton worked a bit at one of his specialties, kicking off.

Jim Corum is expected to have first call at the right guard position and Gerry Lyons at the left half slot.

Other Starters

Other possible offense starters for Medford are Tom Hamlin and Mike Russell, ends; Dick Sorenson and Tom Morris, tackles; George Ice or Frank Albert, guard; Jim Funston, center; Tony Brauner, quarterback; Ron Reich or Bob Gee, right halfback, and Larry Brown, fullback.

Starting defensive line may

be much the same as last week against Grants Pass with Pete Rasmussen, Gary Winetrou, Mike Murray, Don Harrison and Hamlin. Probable linebackers are Jim Funston, Corum and Jim Clark with Gee and Brown at halfbacks and Lyons at safety.

Backfield starters on offense for Beaverton likely will be Mike McGettigan, quarter; Mickey Sinnerud, left half; Steve Cook, right half, and Steve Beguin.

Sinnerud is said to be the big gun in the Beaverton running attack but last week Cook collected most of the rushing laurels. Reich and Gee have paced the Tornado on the ground this season but Jones, Lyons, Bennett and Brown also have done some good gaining.

Spiegelberg said that the Medford crew will leave town about 7:30 a.m. tomorrow. Only 33 members will be permitted to suit down for the contest.

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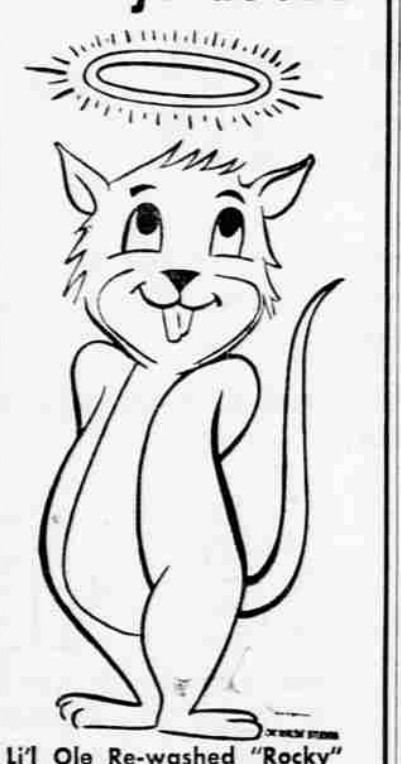
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
