The state department of motor vehicles has released names of 284 drivers whose licenses were ordered suspended between Nov. 12 and 15.

Naples, Italy.—An explosion sank an Italian freighter undergoing repairs in port Thursday, killing at least two men and injuring 100.

Italian navy divers were sent down to determine if any crewmen or workers went down with the 2,285-ton Annamaria Tevoli. The explosion rocked the entire port section of Naples. Port fireboats raced to the side of

the stricken vessel to rescue survivors and battle the flames. The explosion in the boilers ripped two holes in the sides of the freighter. The ship went down at its moorings, with only its prow visible.
