Stock Market Makes Up Most Losses Today

New York — The stock market came back like a lion today and made up most of the losses suffered Tuesday on news of the President's illness.

Tuesday's sharp sell-off depressed stock prices to the point where bargain hunters couldn't resist the urge to buy.

The rally restored more than four billion dollars to market values, which was about one billion shy of what had been lopped off Tuesday.

The oils featured on the upside as a group. Gulf Oil was the pace-setter rising eight points at its high. It lost part of its gain later. Amerada, Shell, Socony-Mobil, Cities Service, Union Oil of California, and Skelly all were strong. Zenith rose almost 10 points at its high and touched a new high in the television-electronics group.
