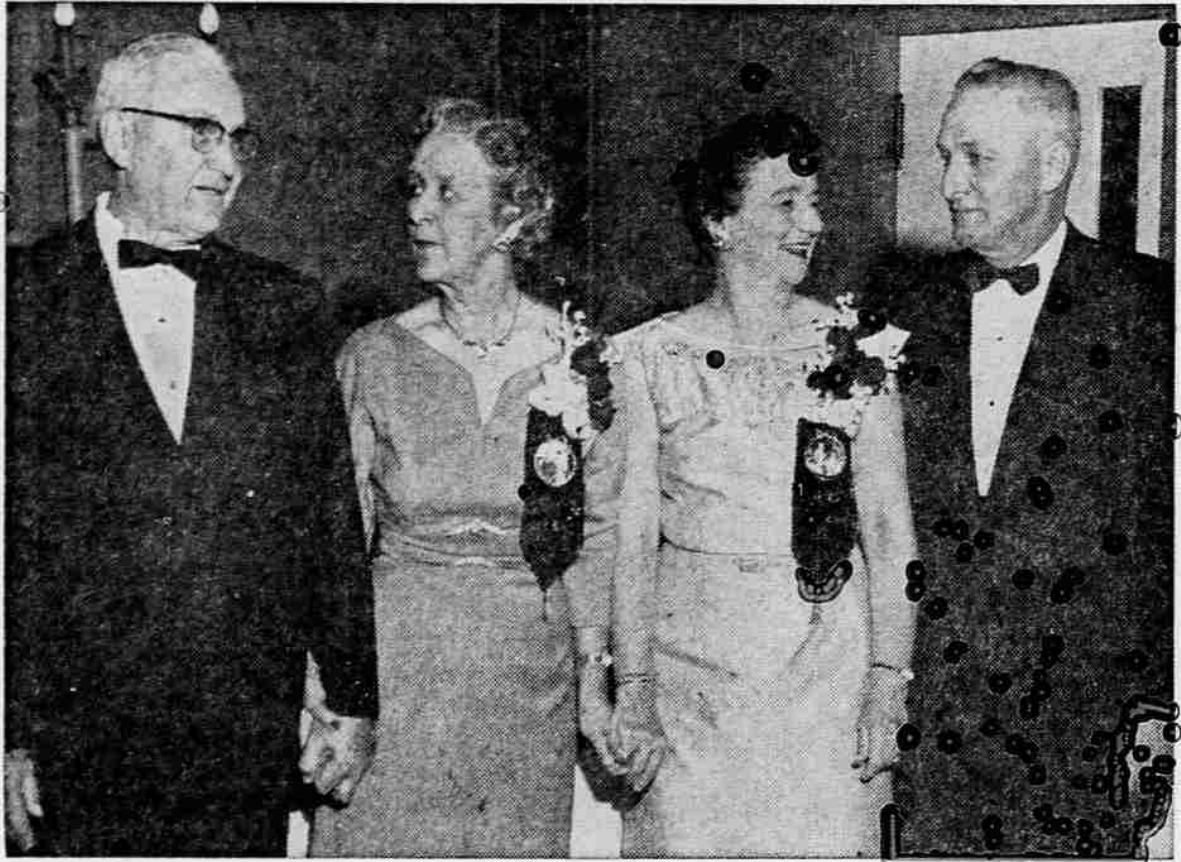


## Two Anniversaries Observed at Dinner

Second artist to appear in Medford for Jackson County Civic Music association this season is Robert Mueller, pianist. The concert will be given Monday, December 9, at the Medford High school auditorium at 8 p.m.

Mr. Mueller, who is recognized as an able interpreter of modern music, has appeared with the San Francisco Symphony, the Sacramento Philharmonic, the University of Miami Symphony, and other orchestras and chamber ensembles in the United States and Europe.

He won the San Francisco Music Critics Award in 1953, and the San Francisco Symphony Foundation Award in 1955. As a boy of sixteen and seventeen he appeared with the New York City Symphony and in recitals. During the war he qualified as a pilot.

For his Medford appearance Mr. Mueller will include selections by Beethoven, Schumann, Scarlatti, Debussy, and Liszt.

Besides his professional activities the pianist is an avid collector of phonograph records, an amateur photographer, and enjoys swimming. When not on tour he makes his home in Berkeley, Calif.
