served the wedding cake, while Mrs. Homer Hylton poured the coffee, and Miss Jean Drysdale presided at the punch bowl.

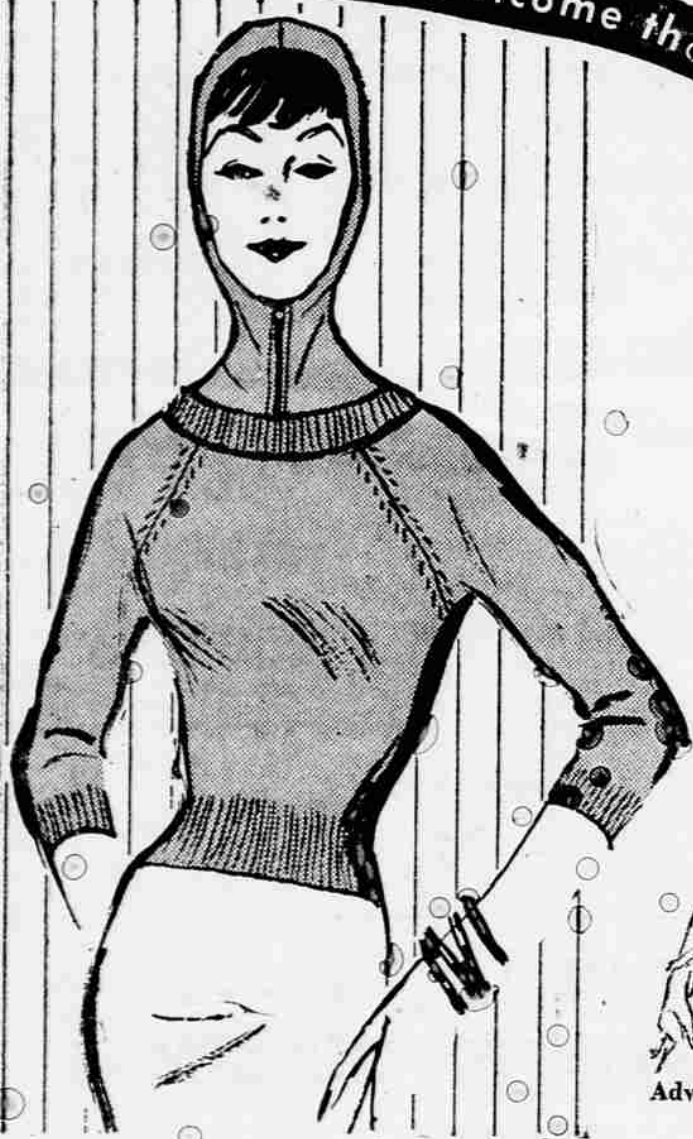

The bride attended Medford High school and is employed by Sacred Heart hospital. Mr. Garrett also attended Medford High school and is employed by Beck's Bakery.

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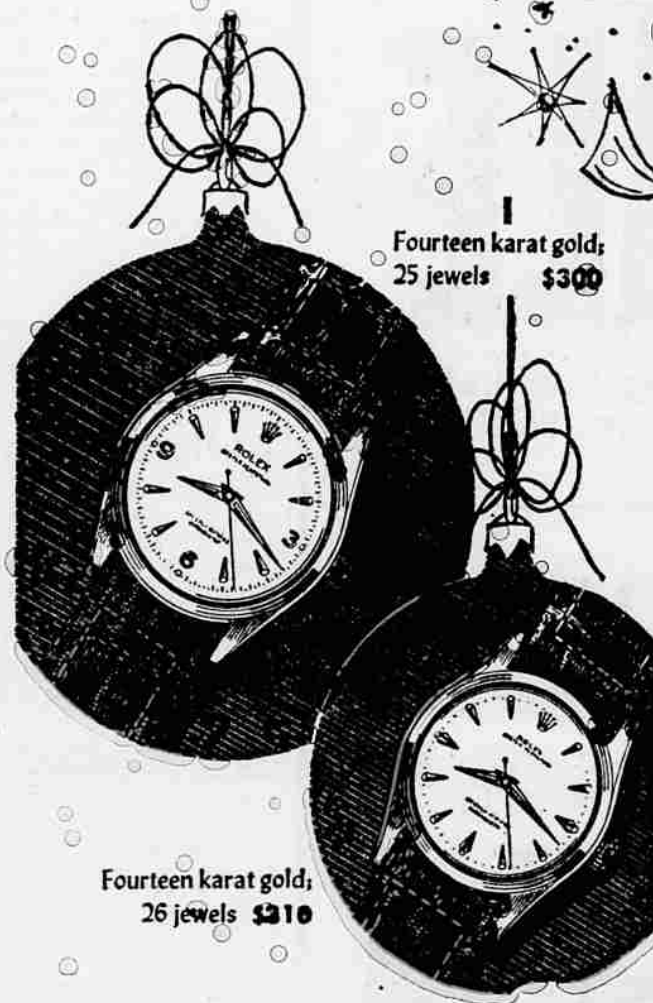
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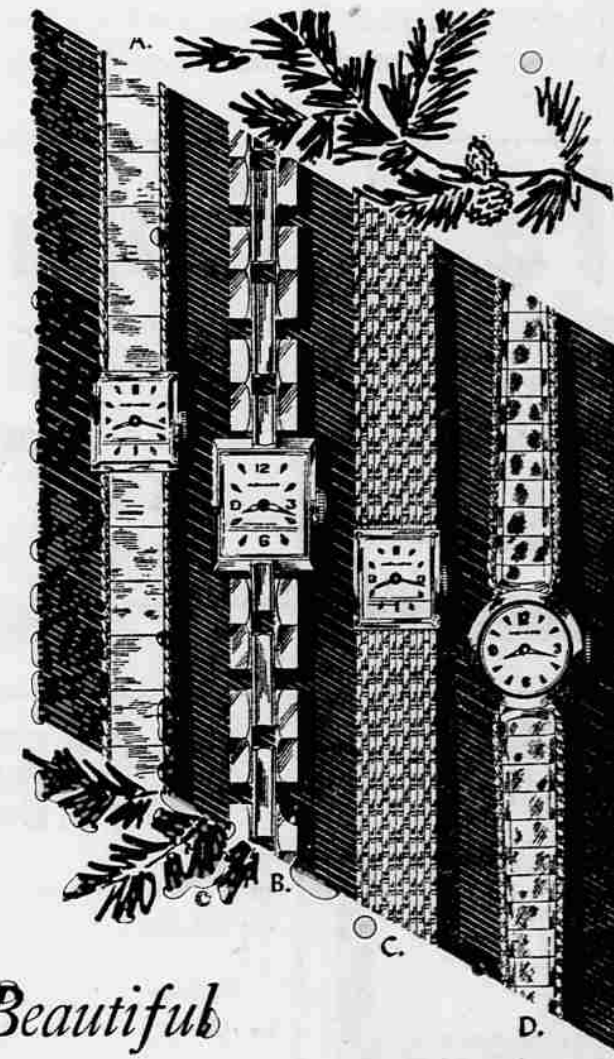


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
