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Hen-Pecking of Males Starts Before Marriage, Study Shows

Hen-pecking a husband begins early these days—even before marriage.

So reported Lester Rand, president of the Youth Research Institute, which studies the tastes, habits and thinking of the nation's teenagers.

Rand said some boys going steady turn their allowances and earnings over to their girls to manage, and the girls promptly put the boys on a budget. He said this is only a "brush fire" trend, for now, but other young people who have heard of the custom think it's a good idea.

Other hen-pecking habits he listed: Older teenage girls go shopping with the boys and have a strong, often final, voice in what is purchased; the girls begin correcting the boys' appearance and manners; some even

talk their "steadies" into cutting down on sweets and smoking, and boss the hours they keep.

"The husband of the future gives every indication of being completely housebroke," said Rand. "Most of the spadework is being done at a very malleable age."

Let your taste be your guide in choice of wines with the holiday turkey, says Don W. McColly, president of the California Wine Institute.

McColly said that at this time of the year, the institute is deluged with letters and telephone calls asking which wine goes with the bird.

"It is proper to serve any dinner wine—red, white, rose, still or sparkling—with turkey," he said. "All the old rules have been thrown out, and it's simply a matter of personal taste. But most of us seem to enjoy the drier dinner wines at mealtime,

sweet dessert wines afterward, and of course, sherry at any time."

Interior decorating still is largely a matter of do-it-yourself rather than hiring the professional, one study shows.

Researchers for a tile flooring manufacturer talked with 4,200 home owners, in income brackets from \$8,000 to \$25,000 a year, living in \$18,000 to \$65,000 homes.

Some 72 per cent said they didn't use a decorator because of the expense involved. Fourteen per cent gave a variety of reasons, from not knowing decorator costs to not realizing what a decorator offers in service.

Arabia, selling in a New York shop for \$495. The second, a complete suit of armor, vintage 16th Century, on sale at an antiques shop. The price, \$6,500.

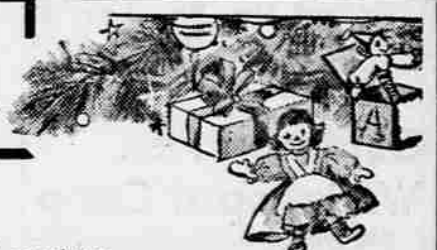
The shop said it would fit "a king-sized modern knight."

Mushroom Dish

New York—Try creamed mushrooms with almonds for a meatless party dish, concocted by the California Foods Research Institute.

Sliver 1/4 cup blanched almonds. Place in shallow pan with 1/2 teaspoon butter or oil. Roast in slow oven (300 degrees) 20 to 25 minutes, or until lightly browned. Stir frequently. Slice 1 1/2 cups fresh mushrooms (or 1 cup canned) and cook slowly in 1 tablespoon butter about 5 minutes. Stir into 1 cup medium-thick white sauce. Add almonds and serve at once on toast or patty shells. Serves 4.

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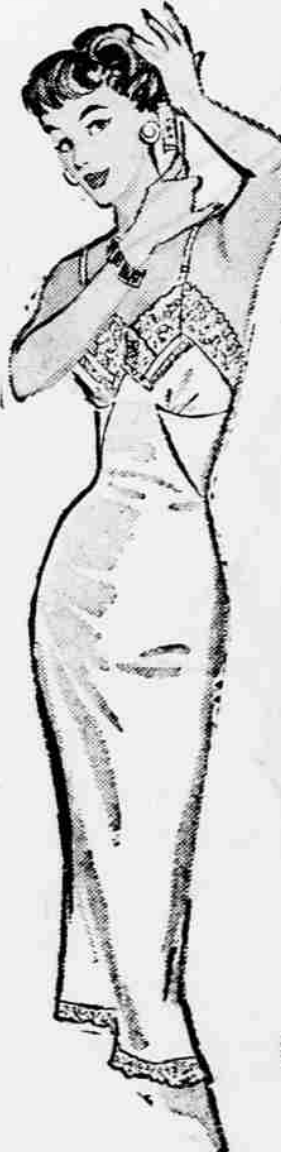
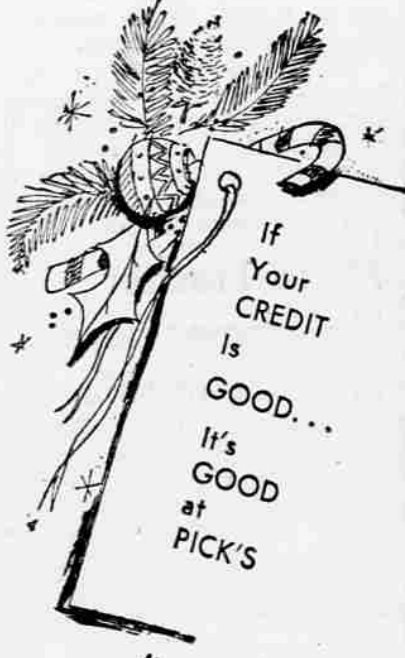
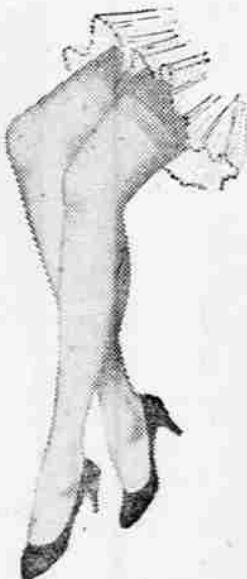
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
