

News About Books From the Library

Mechants of Medford recently issued a single shopper's card that may be used to charge merchandise in several business houses. They believe that the system will result in more accurate bookkeeping for them as well as in greater convenience for their customers.

The library card is a similar convenience. Did you know that it can be used in any agency of the Jackson County library system as well as at the Medford Public library headquarters, no matter where you reside?

Only two simple requirements are made for obtaining such a card: one, that you be a resident of the area from which the library derives its support; and two, that you fill out and sign an application furnishing certain pertinent information as to your address and occupation, thus agreeing to observe library regulations.

Form of Identification
For the borrower's own protection the library requests that some form of identification be presented at the time application for a card is made. It takes only a moment or two to fill out this application, and books may be borrowed at once.

One of the chief advantages of a county library system lies in the fact that all books housed in all agencies can be made available upon request to any reader in the county. The 54 new books recently donated to the Talent community branch by M. R. Dedrick for instance are for the special use of Talent readers, but can be borrowed, if needed, by a reader living in any other Jackson county community. So can any of the 108 books donated during the past four weeks by Miss Mary Ellen Bell, Mrs. Fred M. Brown, Central Point, Lucile V. Boenig, John Reter, Erle M. Gray, Carl Bjorndahl, Arthur H. Thompson, and Mrs. E. P. Ireland. American Legion Post 15, the Medford Rose Society, and an anonymous donor gave the library funds for the purchase of books.

During the past two weeks a total of 269 books were added to the library. Of the 98 new adult titles included 19 were selected especially for teen-age readers. The list of these and all new adult titles follows:

County Men Bound Over to Grand Jury

Two Gold Hill men and a 17-year-old boy were arrested by Ashland and Medford city police and sheriff's deputies Wednesday afternoon and lodged in county jail on charges of grand larceny.

Arrested were David William Regan, 18, and William Raymond Dyer, 20, both route 2, box 517, Gold Hill. The boy is being held pending action by juvenile authorities.

The men were arrested on Table Rock rd. after Ashland police notified sheriff's deputies that the trio sold several new tires and wheels in the vicinity. According to authorities, seven tires and wheels, a tool box and bumper jack, seven hub-caps, and a speaker from a drive-in-theater were found in the car at the time of the arrest.

The two men were bound over to the grand jury in district court Friday morning and were lodged in county jail in lieu of \$1,500 bond each.

Each monkey will get a Christmas package from a chimp obtained by Mrs. Billie Shannon of Idaho Springs, Colo., who has been conducting the party for 20 years. A Christmas tree, decorated especially for the monkeys, will later be given to a needy child.

A chimpanzee named "Buttons" who performs on a local television program, will hand

out the gifts as Santa Claus. He will assume the role of Mrs. Shannon's own monkey, "Skip-pit," who was Santa Claus for the party for years, until he died in 1952.

The party will be held outside if the weather is good. Otherwise, it will be conducted in the monkey house. It will be held Dec. 22.
