## Comment . . . TELEVISION and RADIO

The Broadcasting Foundation of America was organized to exchange cultural radio and later television programs between the United States and the rest of the world but its primary emphasis is on bringing other cultures to this country rather than impressing our culture on other people.

The eminent social anthropologist Robert Redfield, who is chairman of the board of B.F.A., has explained the aims of his organization in an article in "The Saturday Review": "Alexis de Tocqueville characterized us as gregarious and reported that the American 'speaks to you as if he were addressing a town meeting.' He found us ever willing to tell strangers of the superiority of American life.

"I do not condemn our attempt to tell other people how good we are. I think it is necessary to talk to other people and it is human to want to talk about one's self so as to appear in a good light. But I do think that our talking is insufficiently balanced by listening. I do not think that we listen enough to what other people are trying to say to us about themselves."

To correct that, B.F.A. is distributing programs from overseas to big city radio stations here. Distributing our programs to them will come later. The original aim was to interest fifty radio stations in big cities in

carrying cultural programs from other countries. To its great surprise, the Foundation found a great hunger for this sort of thing. Seventy-seven stations have declared they want to take foreign programs on a regular basis. Many of them want as much as the B.F.A. can provide. Others want a couple of hours a week. Some program managers wrote that they had wanted this sort of program for years but didn't know how to go about getting it. Apparently, we are not so reluctant to listen after all.

In the beginning, nearly all the programs that B.F.A. will provide will be essentially music with commentary about the music in English. Later there will be poetry, discussions on the fine arts and science, and other things.

Nearly all the 77 stations lined up so far are commercial stations, most of them independents with network affiliations. Many commercial stations around the country are making money with egg-head programs such as readings of Dylan Thomas' poetry, Siobhan McKenna reading "Ulysses" and so forth.

"We expect to have an audience like that of the Third Programme in England," says Chloe Fox, who is executive director of the B.F.A. "The people who listen to us will be—I hate to use the expression—the opinion makers."

B.F.A. is operating now under a grant from the Rockefeller Foundation and trying to get a grant from another large foundation. If they get it, the Foundation will start active programming early next year. Countries that have already sent in programs or will do so shortly include: Korea, Japan, Nationalist China, France, Italy, Turkey, India (a series of fifty-one programs on Indian music and explanations of it), New Zealand (programs on Maori music, and contemporary New Zealand composers), Israel, Sweden (programs on ballet, cinema, literature), Finland, Austria (music from the Salzburg Festival), Portugal, Greece, Poland, Yugoslavia and Nigeria. B.F.A. has done nothing yet in South America or South Africa but they will come later.

According to Mrs. Fox, people in the Far East have wanted to effect this kind of exchange for years. They have never known how to go about it before.

## Korea Urged To Utilize Oregon Fair

Seoul — An American businessman currently on a Far East tour to promote an international trade fair in Portland, Ore., in 1959, has urged Korea to utilize the fair as a means of increasing her exports.

Robert Young, 63, a member of a four-member International Trade Fair Advisory committee of Oregon's Centennial committee, said he is confident Korea can promote herself as "an active exporting country through the Portland fair."

Young, who describes himself as an "independent" businessman, said he is traveling at his own expense to get as many foreign nations as possible to take part in the exposition.

The fair is scheduled to begin June 10, and continue through Oct. 10, 1959, he said.

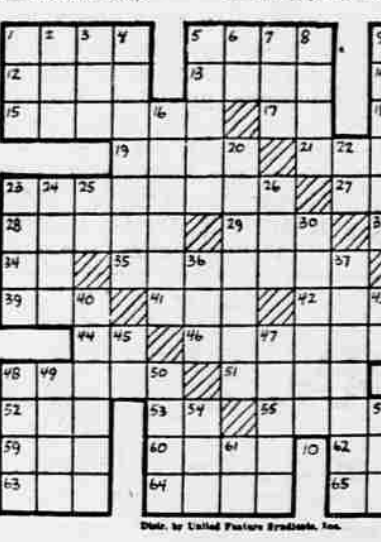
