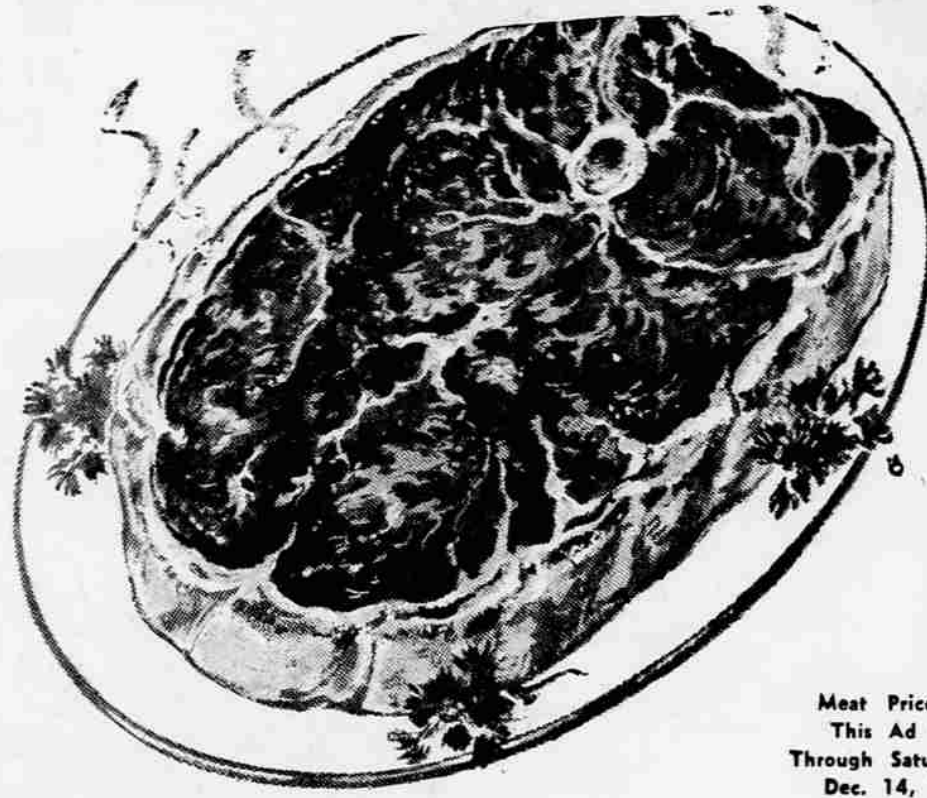

Chemical Increases Poinsettia Longevity

Minneapolis — A University of Minnesota floriculturist is getting good results with experiments to increase the lasting quality of poinsettias.

Those popular Christmas plants will retain their showy red leaves longer, R. E. Widmer found, if they are treated with a chemical growth regulator normally used on tomatoes.

Five weeks after the chemical had been applied, the poinsettias had lost only one-fifth to one-sixth as many leaves as did untreated plants.

Widmer warned that growth regulators should be applied by greenhouse operators, not consumers. He said only a minute quantity of the chemical should be used. A slight excess might result in distorted growth or injury to the plant.
