

Stevenson Sees Need To Restore Allies' Confidence in U.S.

Chicago—Adlai E. Stevenson Monday assailed the "rages of Humphrey, Wilson and yesterday's heroes" to the nation's missile program and said the United States must restore its allies' confidence in her promises of aid even at the risk of nuclear war.

In an address prepared for delivery before a chapter meeting of the American Civil Liberties Union, and revised by him almost up to the time he rose to speak, Stevenson said he was "hopeful that the measures taken at NATO this week will go far to restore solidarity and strength to the Atlantic Community."

Confidence Said Shaken

In his address, he said that the Soviet success with launching the sputniks had shaken the United States' confidence in it-

self. He attacked Eisenhower administration policy and leaders for their actions "at the dawn of the space age."

He said he took the advisor's post in recognition that "we are in serious trouble because of a crisis of confidence in the Western alliance."

"That, like many others, I warned of our dangers and failures long before Suez is no consolation now," said the twice-defeated Democratic presidential candidate. "What is reassuring is that people are listening at last and our government is going to work, albeit slowly and uncertainly, to rebuild our alliances and strengthen our defenses."

He said a greater peril than our response to sputnik was the Soviet's progress to win "The uncommitted peoples and tip the scale of power by subversion, propaganda, and a political and economic penetration."

"This is the hot war now," he said.

Must Meet Assault

"I am pleading, in short, for recognition now that missiles aren't enough, that we measure and meet the subtle Soviet-Chinese assault on the poor and politically uncommitted areas now, while there is yet time. No piecemeal, half-hearted or indecisive approach will suffice, no action that is timid, restrained or cheap. For this war, declared long since, is now well along toward the final stages, as Egypt, Syria, Afghanistan, and other tottering territories testify."

Stevenson did not mention the full names of Wilson and Humphrey, but obviously referred to former Defense Secretary Charles Wilson and former Treasury Secretary George Humphrey. Nor did he identify "yesterday's heroes."

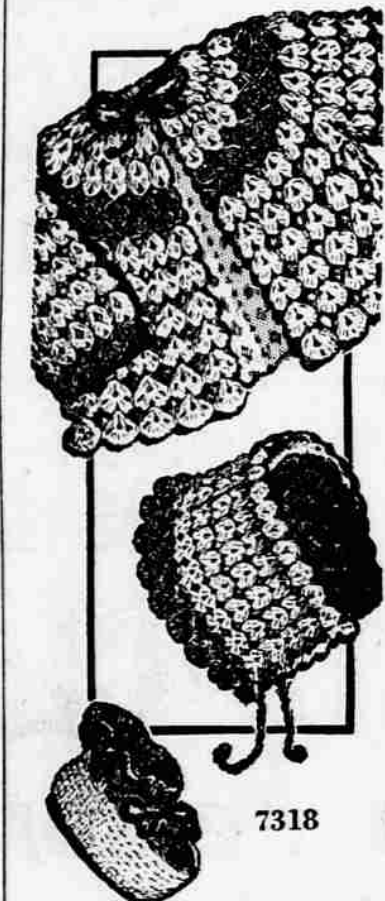

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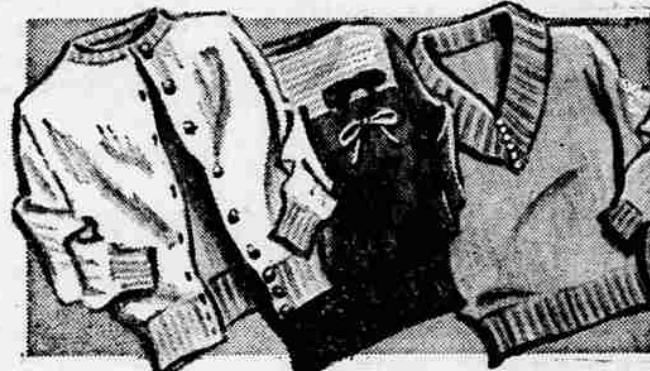
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
