

### Suspended Licenses Listed by State

Salem — The department of motor vehicles has released names of 399 drivers whose licenses were ordered suspended during the period beginning Dec. 9 and ending Dec. 13.

Length of suspension varies, depending on charges involved, recommendation of court, discretionary action by the department or requirements of Oregon law. The department said some of licenses involving financial responsibility and court recommendations may have been reinstated after suspension was ordered.

The department warned drivers that an arrest for driving while suspended may lead to a jail sentence and fine and must result in an additional period of suspension.
