

Federal Aid To Education Greatest Need, Morse Says

Tokyo — Sen. Wayne Morse of Oregon said today "the greatest foreign policy need of the United States during the next 50 years is federal aid to education."

The Democratic member of the Senate Foreign Relations Committee said the United States cannot stay ahead of Russia in manpower, and that its only hope to remain ahead of Russia "is in brainpower."

May Be Higher Caliber
Morse, chief American delegate to the recent Commonwealth Parliamentary Conference in India, warned that Russian education on "the high school and college level may well be of higher caliber than it is in the U. S."

"I would hate to see an across-the-board test on all education between high school students in Russia and the United States," he said.

Morse, a teacher himself for 21 years, said it is alarming to realize that "23 per cent of

the high schools in the U. S. do not offer a course in chemistry or physics."

Process Superior

He said Russia's educational process of finding bright students and providing them with a college education was superior to the U. S. emphasis on mass education.

Morse also said he favored settling the issue of war and

peace through the United Nations.

"An extraordinary session of the United Nations to dramatize the war and peace issue — with all nations laying down their blueprints for peace — is preferable to a summit meeting between the heads of the great powers," Morse said.

Workers Get Raise

Pendleton — More than 60 Umatilla county road department employees will receive a wage increase of five cents an hour effective Jan. 1, County Judge D. R. Coow said today.

Judge Cook said the boost was a "bonus for . . . an excellent job," and was in line with a rise in the cost of living. He said it was separate from another proposed increase of 10 cents an hour for the road employees expected next July.

Russia Promotes Woman in Party

Moscow — Mme. Ekaterina Furtseva, the first and only woman to achieve a prominent position in the Soviet hierarchy, was relieved of her duties with the Moscow city party committee Wednesday night to work full-time activities on a national level.

An announcement said Mme. Furtseva has been "freed from her commitments" with the Moscow unit "in connection with . . . her transfer . . . to permanent work as a secretary of the party Central committee."

Mme. Furtseva will be succeeded as first secretary of the Moscow committee by Vladimir Ustinov, the announcement said. It said the shift was decided at a plenary session of the Moscow committee.

Western observers today saw little significance in the move. They said it was simply a routine decision usually made

Canadians Plan To Buy Pendleton Hotel

Pendleton — A group of Canadian businessmen headed by Charles Nemetz of Regina, Saskatchewan, planned to purchase the lease of the Pendleton hotel today. Purchase price of the 100-room hotel was not announced, but it is believed to be in excess of \$75,000.

The hotel is owned by the Pendleton Hotel Corporation. Nemetz represents United Hotels, Inc., with hotels in Canada and Washington state. He is former owner of several Canadian utility firms, including Dominion Electric of Regina.

Norma Talmadge Funeral on Friday

Hollywood — The body of Norma Talmadge has been returned to the land of make believe where she reigned as queen in the golden days of the silver screen.

The beautiful star of the silent screen died Tuesday in Las Vegas, where she had lived since 1946 with her third husband, Dr. Carvel James. She was 60.

Funeral services were scheduled tentatively for Friday afternoon, pending the arrival from Florida of Miss Talmadge's sister, Constance. A third sister, Natalie, lives in Santa Monica. All the Talmadge sisters were famous in the pre-talkie days, but Norma was the "queen" of Hollywood as a romantic star and as the wife of movie mogul Joseph Schenck, whom she wed in 1916.

EX-CONGRESSMAN DIES
Sloatsburg, N. Y. — Robert Henry Gittins, 87, former congressman from New York, one-time owner and publisher of the Niagara Falls, N.Y., Journal and a corporation lawyer, died Wednesday in Tuxedo, N.Y., Memorial Hospital. Gittins, a Democrat, served in the House of Representatives from 1913 to 1915.

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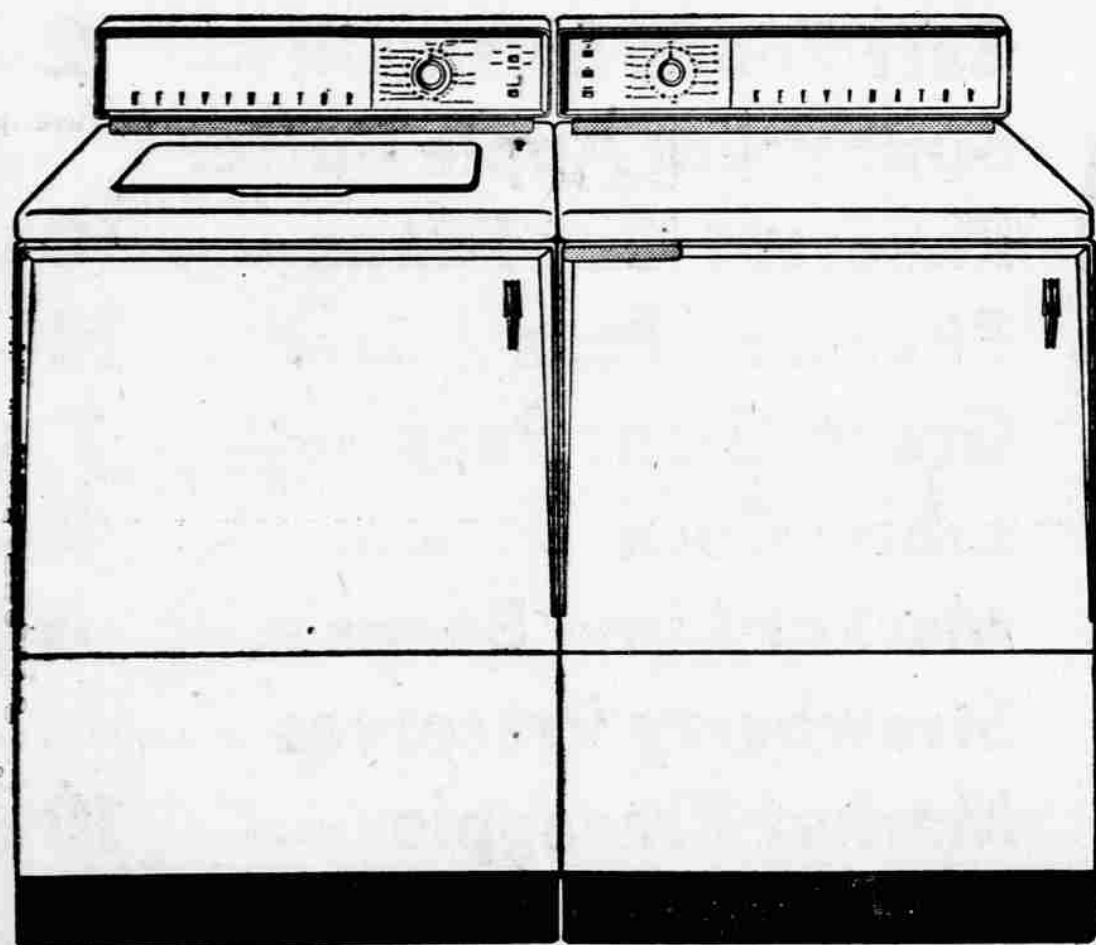


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
